THE DINTON BEER FESTIVAL



Another Successful Dinton Beer Festival

The Dinton Beer Festival could not be held last year due to the Government Covid pandemic restrictions and we approached this year's session with some trepidation as the weather forecast was ominous with rain and thunderstorms expected through the afternoon. So during the Saturday morning of the festival we borrowed and erected several gazebos from the Dinton Fete to augment the two marquees which the Haddenham Beer Festival had kindly offered us. Steph went on social media and let potential customers know that we would have them covered. People hiked from Haddenham, walked from Upton, cycled from Ford and generally dropped in from Gibraltar, Westlington and Dinton. The large family-based crowd was entertained with live music, and there was a fine selection of real ales on offer together with a Pimm's and Cider tent whilst Steph laid on a barbecue selling high class delicious hamburgers and sausages. Dinton Wines had a stall introducing their new Dinton Folly Pink – a delightful sparkling rosé which by all accounts is a great success.

As it turned out, we were absolutely blessed with good fortune as the heavy rain-bearing clouds seemed to divide as they reached Dinton, leaving us dry throughout the afternoon until five o'clock when three things happened at once – the band finished their gig, the last barrel was emptied as the last available pint was poured, and the heavens opened, with some serious rain. A dramatic end to a very well attended festival. Not all the figures are available yet, but we took in some £3100 on the day – well up on the previous best takings of £2355 in 2019. So, there will be a decent amount of money available to donate to some parish projects.

A big thank you must go to all the volunteers, from Dinton, Ford, Upton and Westlington who helped us to set up, manned all the stalls on the day and cleared away the debris afterwards. Special mention must go to Steph and her staff, who all worked so hard to make the day a success and were unstinting in their help.

Of course, the event could not happen without the generosity of the sponsors who sponsored the real ales, Pimm's and cider, the music and the Festival glasses. It is this generosity of spirit, manifested by the helpers and sponsors together which makes the Dinton Beer festival such a successful family community get-together.

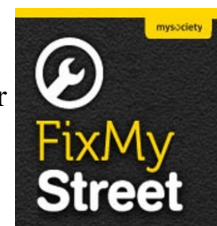


WHICH PAVEMENT & WHO FIXES IT?

If you have a problem with a footpath/pavement, you need to register the problem with Buckinghamshire Council Fix-my-Street reporting system — 01296 382416 or www.fixmystreet.buckscc.gov.uk If your problem is with a Public Footpath crossing a farmers or other landowner land or a Bridleway then please contact Buckinghamshire Council Rights of Way Team.

They prefer you to use their website for reporting problems.

This includes: broken stiles, overgrown vegetation or fallen trees, damaged or dangerous path surfaces, damaged or dangerous bridges, damaged or missing signposts and waymarks. Landowners are required to keep rights of way open and useable; this includes providing and maintaining stiles and gates and making sure they are safe and easy to use.
