He was generous with Frugality :
Charitable without Ostentation,
of an humane, peaceable & forgiving Temper.

In Religion he was devout & Chearful :
And tho' he was zealous for his own Profession in it,
He had Charity for the Sincere of all Persuasions.

He was happy in the Enjoyment of a few Select Friends,
And preserv'd their Esteem by his Good Nature & Sincerity.

The unaffected Concern of Those
Declare his Merit & their Lofs .

But the nearer Relations of his Life
Feel most Sensibly
the Misfortune of his Death :
For he liv'd an affectionate & indulgent Father
To one Son & two Daughters;
Whom he train'd up to Happiness
By teaching them Virtue.

He left also behind him a disconsolate Widow ;
who from a pious Regard to the Memory
of a kind & tender Husband
Erected this Monument .

He died Aged 59 Years on Jan: 7th 1747.

Colonel Richard Bake late of this Parish
and Elizabeth his wife third Daughter
of S^r Thomas Lee of Hartwell Bar^o.
Thay had Issue Ann married to Marle
Antonie Esq. Elizabeth who Dyed young
and Mary married to John Baynes Esq.
Serj. at Law. The Colonel was many years
in a Commission of Peace & Commissioner
of Appeals, served in Parliament
once for Alesbury, thrice for Wendover.
They were just and Beneficent
therefore Lived Beloved & Dyed Lamented.
He on the 29th of Nov^r 1707 Aged 70
She on the 30th of May 1737 Aged 74
