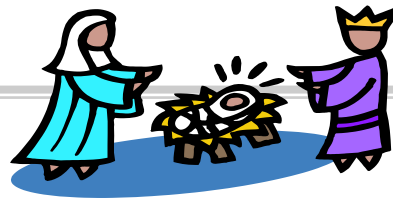
## Graffiti in Bus Shelters

## WIND TURBINE

The Parish Council is opposed to the application for a Wind Turbine at Lower Waldrige Farm in Ford and that we are considering what action(s) we might take in support of our opposition.

As a first step we have joined forces with the Ford Action Group Against Turbines (FAGAT) and Ford Village Society (FVS) to oppose the application.

We believe that by working together we will maximise our efforts but we will, of course, also continue to need your help and support.

The combined opposition group has a number of actions in mind including illustrating the proportions of the proposed wind turbine and its visual impact by flying a suitably sized balloon adjacent to the proposed wind turbine site and organising demonstration(s) ahead of the AVDC Development Control Committee meeting at which the application will be decided (the latter probably 17th January 2013 but yet to be confirmed by AVDC).

We will keep the Parish informed of opposition events, explain what you can do to help us, and advise you of the confirmed date on which the application will be considered by AVDC, through flyers over the coming weeks. In the meantime AVDC are still accepting written comments on the application so, if you have not yet written, please do so and make your feelings known. ## **How To Report Fraud & Internet Crime**

From 3 December 2012, all reports of fraud in the Thames Valley will be recorded by Action Fraud and individual police forces in the south east will no longer take any fraud reports. They will now be recorded centrally by Action Fraud.

If you want to report a fraud, please call the number above (0300 123 2040), or visit the Action Fraud website at [www.actionfraud.police.uk](http://www.actionfraud.police.uk) Thames Valley Police will continue to respond to reports of frauds in progress, but any other calls to report a fraud, including financially motivated e-crime, will be referred to Action Fraud. When a person calls to report a fraud, they will be provided with the Action Fraud phone number or website address.

The new process will have a number of benefits for victims of crime, including having a central point of contact to report all fraud; an effective and efficient way to bulk report fraud; and an increased chance of identifying repeat and vulnerable victims.
