WIND TURBINE APPEAL

The Parish Council has written to the Planning Inspector to ask that the decision by Aylesbury Vale District Council Development Control Committee to reject the application is upheld for the following reasons:

- The grounds for refusal as recommended by Aylesbury Vale District Council Officers were valid.
- The major impact on the landscape of the Vale is potentially harmful given that it is an area which is unhindered by vertical structures.
- The impact on the vistas into and out of the Chilterns AONB are significant and detrimental.
- The proposal would have a significantly damaging effect on the setting of listed buildings in Ford and in adjacent conservation areas. The quantum of opposition by the local, and wider, communities is large. The environmental impact would be both great and be damaging to the amenities of the adjacent communities.
- In addition, and for the above reasons, we urge that this appeal is subject to an open Public Inquiry in order that the issues raised by the appellant can be considered openly.
- If the Inspectorate decide that the appeal is to be determined at a Public Inquiry the Dinton with Ford and Upton Parish Council would seek Rule 6 Third Party Status.

The Parish Council requested the Planning Inspector allow the appeal to be heard in public—The request was refused and the appeal will be by written representation. The Inspector received many letters asking for a public hearing.

On Friday 28th June the school will hold a day of celebration to formally 'open' the new building. During the day there will be a number of events for the children including a blessing by the Area Dean, Canon Andrew Blythe, a visit from John Bercow, Speaker of the House of Commons and many fun activities. From 5.30 we would like to open the celebrations to parents and the wider school community. This will be an informal event on the school field and supporters of the school are welcome to join in and share the celebration. On 30th April the Junior Choir of Cuddington and Dinton School consisting of 34 pupils took part in a performance of 'Echoes 5' at The Royal Albert Hall. This was an amazing event, involving 1,950 junior school children from 59 schools across Buckinghamshire. We are extremely proud of our pupils who performed magnificently on the spectacular stage with a full orchestra and conductor.

On 22nd May we held a concert in the new Junior school hall. There were wonderful performances from the choir, the Year 3 violins, and many other pupils who study music both in school and outside school. The standard of performance was extremely high and it was a pleasure to see the new hall, stage, sound and lighting being used.

Poor weather has prevented the school holding a full sports day for the past two years, this year the dates are scheduled as follows: 21st June for juniors, 25th June for infants. We hope that this year will see the playing field in use for some amazing sporting activity.

The year 5 and 6 pupils are working hard at the moment rehearsing for their end of year production, 'Dream On' – a musical based on Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* - which will take place in the Junior hall at the beginning of July.

CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

Annual Meeting of the Parish 2013

The past year has been a testing one for all members of the council and I express my thanks to all of the councillors: Lorraine Gooth (Vice Chairman), Colin Minton, Jon Horn, John Owen, Barbara Green and Giles Kidner. Also many thanks to our Clerk, Keith Gray, who has been very supportive with sound advice, especially to me as a new Chairman.

The other person who cannot be thanked highly enough is our Tree Warden, David Hobden, who has continued to work hard renovating and replanting the Spinney, but who has also been the force behind the replanting of Chestnut Avenue. For those unable to attend on Saturday 6th April, 2013 we installed a plaque commemorating HM Queen Elizabeth's Diamond Jubilee with the planting of 22 Lime trees. The splendid result is there for all to see. The work of David Hobden, John Horn and not least John Owen in making this possible cannot be over emphasised. Thank you and many thanks to all those who helped with the planting and for those who made contributions to the purchase of the trees and plaque.

The last year has produced several challenges where we have sought to either mediate or resolve as well as dealing with a Freedom of Information Request; a new experience for all of us. The weather seems to have had a direct or indirect effect on many functions. The snow and cold of 2 weeks ago meant cancelling the annual litter pick but the re-scheduled dates are 13/4/13 for Ford and 27/4/13 for Dinton and Upton. The responses of parishioners in helping with this work will be as excellent as ever in maintaining the parish. The weather has also been a factor in the pace of the school's re-building. However, it is rewarding to see this now come to fruition after a clearly difficult time for the school. The effect of the prolonged bad weather on the roads and paths around the parish is obvious and we have sought to try and badger the Highways Department of Buckinghamshire County Council for repairs, though it may never seem quite enough.

Finally the indirect influence of weather has been in relation to the planning application for a wind turbine at Ford. This has clearly caused much anxiety and concern especially for those living in Ford. The council has spent much time and effort in presenting the plan and then formulating our opposition to the application which was rejected in January by Aylesbury Vale District Council. The applicant has suggested there may be an appeal by written submission and we await formal notice.

The assessment (not granting) of 35 planning applications takes a large part of councillor's time and we try to ensure that neighbours are aware of the planning applications adjacent to them. The value of having District Councillors with extensive knowledge of the planning process has been much valued.

The regular duties of the council have been maintained: grass cutting, emptying of litter and dog bins, parish field maintenance and the bus shelters. The bus shelters were subjected to a spate of graffiti but Jon Horn carried out restoration and hopefully there will not be a repeat. He also maintained a careful eye on the playground and its fencing; more equipment and potential repairs are under consideration. Keeping in touch with parishioners is important and the notice boards have been repaired and maintained whilst the parish council website under the aegis of Colin Minton has been enhanced and will be further developed. We are also grateful for the work on the village website run by Barry and Carol Lynch. The Bigg Issue newsletter continues to be a regular means of information and I am grateful to Lorraine Gooch, Jon Horn and Colin Minton for the production and distribution.

The links with community are also expressed in our involvement with the Remembrance Sunday Services, as well as support for the Dinton Cricket Club and the Marquee Group, who do such a wonderful job in providing the setting for Parish Field events. (continued over page)

In these times of financial hardship for the county I can report that our finances are in good shape and we can thank our Responsible Financial Officer, Mike Thompson, for his diligence and sound accounting. At £1.30 per week to each household the precept will cover us for expense of the wind turbine application and possible development of a Neighbourhood Plan. The latter is presently at a stage where we are awaiting the outcome of a High Court judgement on a challenge to Milton Keynes' Council policy regarding setting minimal distances of turbines from residential accommodation. Financially we anticipate tougher times in 2014.

This report would not be complete without mentioning my further thanks to Sylvia Eaton and Valma Thompson for organising the refreshments to follow, but also to Margaret Aston, our County Councillor, who will not be our County Council representative at the May elections due to the change in the Ward boundaries. We thank her for her many years' service to the parish.

Finally, the best part of living in this Parish for me, and I suspect many others, is the sense of community and support that is expressed in many ways. We, and I, are grateful for all your contributions and look forward to another year of collaboration and involvement.
