ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON A LEAD NEAR LIFESTOCK

Despite notices on village footpaths and an article in the spring issue of this magazine, we are again having to draw attention to the absolute necessity of keeping dogs on leads in or adjacent to fields with livestock.

Since 4th February this year, local

sheep farmer Paul Roads has experienced nine separate attacks on his sheep by dogs, although not all of these attacks were in the Dinton and Ford area.

The latest attack was on the morning of Friday 14th May when Paul discovered one of his ewes in Dinton which had been badly mauled by a dog. The ewe is still alive due to the vet's efforts but it is likely that she will have to be put down soon.

Attacks by dogs are a considerable cost to farmers, with loss of livestock, disruption to their working day and vet's bills.

Once again, we ask all dog owners to keep dogs on a lead when walking anywhere near livestock.

St Peter and St Paul Church, Dinton

Most Church services this year have been online through a link on the Wychertvale website and also live and interconnected on zoom. Now, fortunately, we can get back to our normal pattern of having Holy Communion at 10am on the first Sunday in the month. The second Sunday in the month is Evensong at 6pm. The third Sunday in the month is 10 am Morning Worship. Messy Church is a very popular activity session for families. It has not yet started up again at the time of writing, but it is planned to start very soon now. Messy Church will be on the fourth Sunday every month at 4.30pm.



Also, we continue to have the special services which are advertised separately. Examples are our Patronal Festival, Harvest, Remembrance etc.

Our ministers for services are mainly Phil Groves and Nigel Featherston. A new Rector has recently been appointed for the whole of the Wychertvale Benefice and her name is Cassa Messervy. All contact details are in the Parish News.

The majority of the wedding couples last year and this year postponed their weddings because of the limited numbers allowed although we did manage 2 weddings last year and have another two this year. Unfortunately, the number of funerals has increased but the baptisms had to stop completely and we will all be delighted when we are able to start them again.

The churchyard has been beautiful this spring with the wild flowers looking especially stunning. But we really do need some more help with the strimming and mowing. Please give me a phone call and I will be delighted to welcome you to the Churchyard Gardening group.

During the winter the church sprung some leaks in the roof and it will be repaired by the time this is printed. The porch roof will be retiled, and the main nave roof will be patched. The repairs cost £7,500.00 because it is done to Heritage standards. This is a great deal of money and all donations into Dinton Church Fabric Fund will be very gratefully received. Dinton Church had its five yearly architectural inspection in June. This will enable the Fabric Committee to prioritise any urgent works identified and will probably mean more expenditure out of the Fabric Fund.

We are now able to hold some events at last! The first one will be a concert on 11th September when 'Music in Quiet Place' will play a programme of light classical music. Please come.

WHICH PAVEMENT & WHO FIXES IT?


If you have a problem with a footpath/pavement near the road way or outside your house, you need to register the problem with Buckinghamshire Council Fix-my-Street reporting system — 01296 382416 www.fixmystreet.buckscc.gov.uk If your problem is with a Public Footpath crossing a farmers or other landowner land or a Bridleway then please contact Buckinghamshire Council Rights of Way Team. They prefer you to use their website for reporting problems. This includes: broken stiles, overgrown vegetation or fallen trees, damaged or dangerous path surfaces, damaged or dangerous bridges, damaged or missing signposts and waymarks. Landowners are required to keep rights of way open and useable; this includes providing and maintaining stiles and gates and making sure they are safe and easy to use.

This pandemic has hit the hospitality sector hard and each business has responded to the threat in its own particular way.

For the Seven Stars in Dinton, the closure of the pub in accordance with government rules in March 2020, was the trigger to look at



how the pub needed to change to survive and remain a central part of the community. Steph and Dave ramped up the takeaway business, with a special takeaway menu and decided to augment this with a village shop selling fruit, vegetables, meat, fish, dairy products and bread. This shop not only helped the local community at a very difficult time but provided some outlet for Steph's usual suppliers, who were experiencing a huge downturn in their markets.

Through lockdowns, tier systems and ever changing government rules Steph maintained her takeaway business, introduced open sided marquees, equipped with heaters, into the garden to facilitate open-air dining and recently was able to welcome customers back into the pub and restaurant on 17th May. Through all the difficulties thrown up by Covid, the Seven Stars has remained the hub of the community, offering warmth and cheer to all. We all hope that later on in June all restrictions will be lifted and the Seven Stars can get back to doing what it does best – serving great food and drink and always being there for the community.
