CUDDINGTON & DINTON SCHOOL NEWS

It really does seem no time at all since returning after the Easter break, and May has already been full of activity and opportunity for the children across both sites.

We have quickly settled back into the rhythm of school life, and it has been wonderful to see the children so engaged in their learning both inside and outside the classroom. The recent spell of good weather has helped us make the most of our outdoor spaces, with pupils enjoying Outdoor Days and continuing to benefit from our Forest School provision. These provided valuable opportunities for exploration, teamwork and creativity beyond the classroom and the children embraced them with enthusiasm.

It has also been a busy time for sport and enrichment. Our Year 5 and 6 pupils have represented the school brilliantly at both a Hockey Festival and a Tennis Tournament, showing not only skill but also great sportsmanship and resilience. We are always proud of the way our children conduct themselves when out in the community and these events were no exception.

A particular highlight of the month was the Year 5 and 6 visit to Eythrope for a river study field trip. The children gained hands-on experience to support their learning in geography and science, deepening their understanding of the natural environment. Opportunities such as these really bring learning to life and help to develop curiosity and independence.

In the classroom, the children have continued to work hard. Year 6 approached their SATs with an exemplary attitude, with some even commenting on how much they had enjoyed the experience as they completed their final test. We have also seen fantastic initiative from pupils with the continuation of our pupil-led Science Club, giving children the opportunity to lead their own investigations and share their curiosity with others.

Creativity and performance have also played a central role this half term. Some of our pupils were fortunate enough to take part in the ECHOES performance at the Royal Albert Hall, which was an unforgettable experience for all involved. Back at the infant site, we enjoyed our traditional Cuddington Summer Dancing, and handing out of flowers, a lovely celebration that brings together children, staff and the wider community.

Our commitment to developing the whole child continues to be central to all we do. The OPAL Parent Workshop on play and childhood provided valuable insight into the importance of play in children's development and was very well received by families. It is always a pleasure to work in partnership with parents to support the children's wellbeing and learning.

We greatly value the importance of working closely in partnership with parents and carers and the community; this support, engagement and communication are vital in helping us to provide the very best experiences for every child, and we are extremely grateful for the continued collaboration between home and school and our local villages.

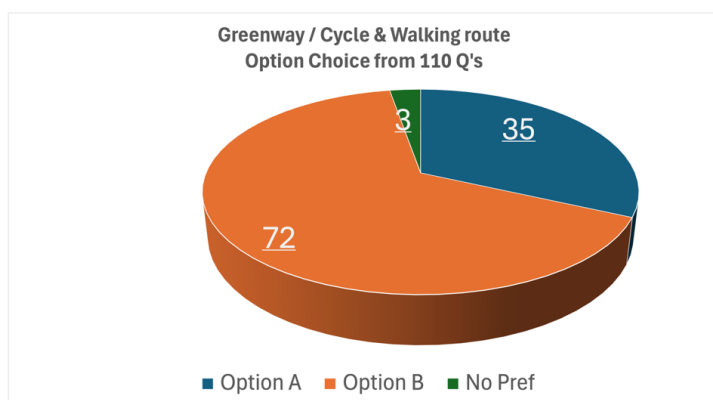
PROPOSED CYCLE ROUTE

Parish Questionnaire Results Summary

Questionnaires were hand delivered to each household in the parish, asking for residents' preference for either of two routes for a proposed walk / cycle route connecting local villages. Parishioners were asked to make their choice between Option A (route proposed by Greenways and Cyclerroutes) and Option B

(route proposed by the Parish Council). The Parish Council would like to thank those parishioners who took the time to return the questionnaire, either hard copy or by email.

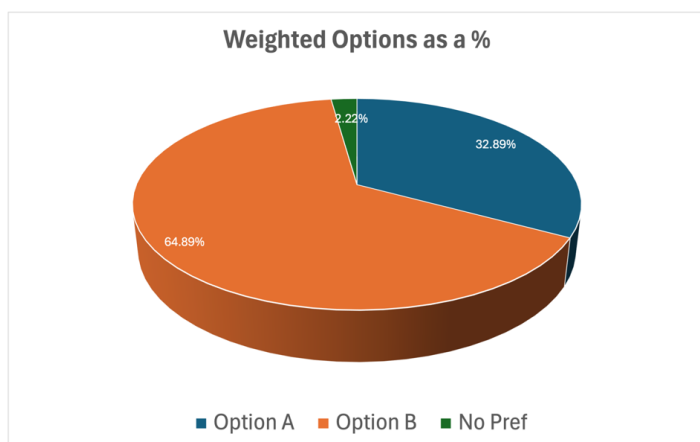
380 questionnaires were distributed to all households and 110 responses were received, a robust return of 28.95% and representing the views of 225 respondents.



The response clearly indicated a preference for Option B, with a factor of two to one (regardless of whether you count questionnaires returned or number of parishioners represented).

In percentage terms 65.45% preferred Option B, with 31.82% preferring Option A and 2.73% showing no preference.

If you weight the response by number of parishioners the result is below: - B 64.89% / A 32.89% / No Pref 2.22%

The responses received were unsurprisingly high from Dinton and Westlington, with 39.62% and 50% respectively, whilst Upton was 21.25% and Gibraltar 13.33%, responses from Ford were 10.67%

The % results were only slightly skewed with the final 'Proceed' question, for as well as the 3 Questionnaires returned with 'No Pref' a further 8 Questionnaires selected either 'Do Not Proceed' or 'Find an Alternative Route', and there was 1 no response.

The top three issues which mattered most to parishioners were Road Safety, Impact on Residents and Quiet Village Environment.

Regarding qualitative feedback, there were several comments against the spoiling of the countryside, the perceived dangers associated with the A 418, the desire to preserve the tranquillity of the village and Conservation Area, and these are reflected in the top five choices of Local Impact Importance.

The Parish Council will take these views of the community into account when considering any Parish Council response to proposals for a walk / cycle route which may arise in the future. In the meantime, the Council will investigate ways in which the existing footpath between Dinton and Haddenham might be improved, to allow all-weather travel for walkers.

Thank you to all those who took part in the parish consultation.
This is to help the parish council understand what our residents think of the proposal.

Further consultation will take place with Buckinghamshire Council.

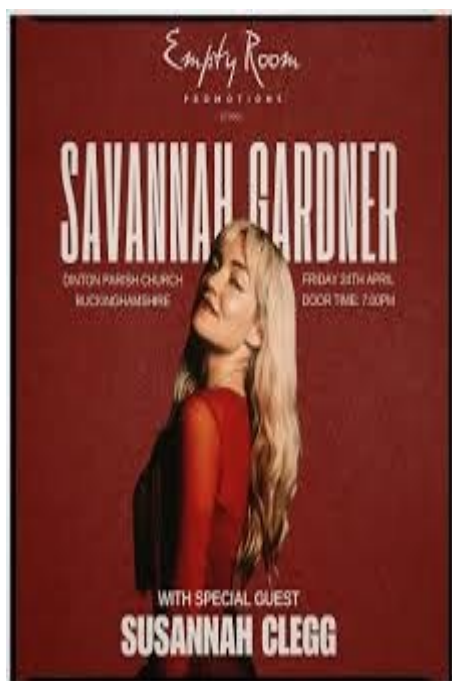

LIVE REVIEW:

SAVANNAH GARDNER BAND SUSANNAH CLEGG

DINTON PARISH CHURCH

After 40 minutes of driving down increasingly narrower roads, it seemed as if the sat nav was playing a cruel trick and that we were nowhere near Dinton or indeed its Parish church, yet seemingly one turn and like Shangri-La it magically appeared before us. As venues go, it offered the most spectacular views on this warm sunny evening, less so later on, when creeping through the graveyard in the dark, but fantastic by day!

This was the choice of Empty Rooms Promotions for a gig featuring the Savannah Gardner Band supported by Susannah Clegg. The interior of the church was as stunning as the outside, with a small bar, a merch area and a nice sized performing space offering unblocked views. With the room made up half of locals

and half of familiar Americana aficionados, more used to gracing the mean streets of London, we settled down to a very special evening.

Susannah Clegg: Susannah's set showed that there is a lot of songwriting technique on display, from the titles playing with our expectations, through to the introduction of a letter midway through - the two simple words "It read" are sung in such a way that you fear for what will follow. Strangely bathed in a red light for most of her set Susannah would open with "Prospect Street", it does take a second or two to attune to her singing voice for although hailing from Lancaster, her vocals are authentically American, all we were missing was a camp fire to sit around. Although written about her hometown if she'd said it was Lancaster Missouri we'd have believed her. For the final verse, the vocal shackles came off and the vocal projections filled the high ceiling of the church.

Savannah Gardner Band: It's been over a year since [#TEAMw21](#) has seen Savannah Gardner play with a full band, and tonight was a reminder that the loss has been all ours. Her band The Recovering Good Girls are a revolving set of gifted musicians normally anchored by Carmen Ruiz Vicente on percussion and backing vocals, another instrumentalist who has the ability to adapt to the room in which she is playing. On guitar and pedal steel tonight, a performer in her own right was Holly Carter while on stand up bass, possibly recovering but definitely not a Good Girl was Tomas Siroky. With her black frills and trademark white boots, Savannah would establish her local credentials by referring to having lived in Thame. It would prove the ideal introduction into "Home Again", Carmen's percussion would be in total sympathy with the surroundings in an evening that would see her in multiple roles. A divine Holly Carter guitar solo and Tomas's warm bass sound, let alone Savannah's contributions got the second part of the evening off to a roaring start. The whole concert was thoroughly enjoyed by all present, and came to an emotional end with a solo version of "This Pain Is Love" which was delicately fragile at times but so beautiful and entrancing that the audience hung on every word, so much so that Savannah had to say "Thank You" to confirm that it had finished, so afraid were they to clap early on another performing masterclass. Leaving us with "Born In The Wrong Generation" with its Bruce Springsteen "Dancing In The Dark" addition, this really brought the curtain down on a most fabulous evening.

Look out for another Empty Room Promotion Gig at Dinton Parish Church later in the year.

Savannah Gardner is a British-American country and Americana artist whose unique blend of storytelling, soulful vocals, and magnetic stage presence has made her a standout figure in the genre.



Village Hall 100 Club fund raising

The Village Hall current account now has a balance of £17,500 and the 100 Club fundraising account totals around £56,000, comprises money from the 100 Club, profits from fundraising events, donations and over £25,000 transferred into an interest savings account which has gained over £400 in interest so far. So, the total Village Hall total finances are approximately £74,000.

These figures also include well over £2,000 raised from the Buy a Brick Legacy campaign. Assuming all the donors qualify for Gift Aid this means the amount donated is close to £3,000 with the additional 25%.

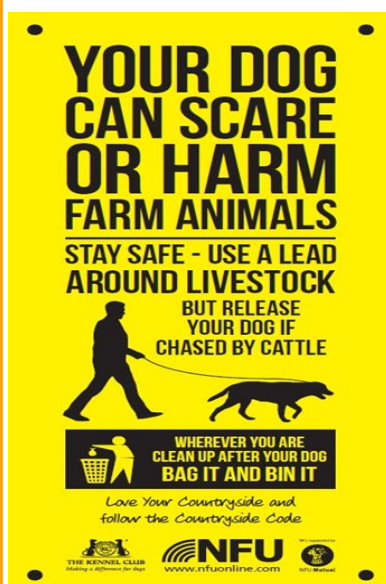

FOOD BANK COLLECTION

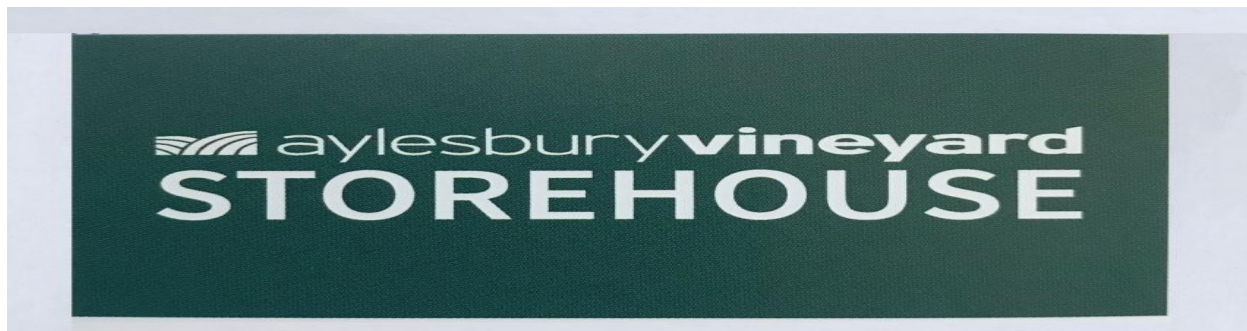
The Seven Stars in Dinton has a foodbank collection box.
