Jane Edwards

Elizabeth Jane Edwards who lived in Dinton and Stone died in hospital on September 8th, 2020.

Jane trained in London where she met her husband Peter, who was then a medical student at St. Thomas's Hospital in the 1950s. Eventually they settled in Aylesbury where Peter became a well respected GP. Jane, as she was known, supported many charities but was not content just to raise money in the U.K. She did much hands-on work to help others abroad. In 1975, when Saigon fell at the end of the Vietnam War, many babies and children were orphaned or separated from their families and were sent abroad. A number came to the Ockenden Venture, a children's charity in Surrey. Jane and her youngest daughter moved in with the children to help with their care and rehabilitation. In 1980, as Yugoslavia was torn by civil war, Jane was horrified by the suffering of the people of Dubrovnik in Croatia. She heard that medicine and drugs, especially for long term cancer treatment, were unavailable, so she collected medicines that were newly out of date from British pharmacies. She persuaded the Red Cross to provide her with an ex-army lorry and caravan and drove it, with a friend, to Dubrovnik, crossing the war zone with the support of NATO troops. Later, soon after the turn of the century, Jane was honoured by the Town of Dubrovnik and was awarded Freedom of the City. Through her Dubrovnik contacts, Jane heard that children in Sarajevo were also living rough in bombed out buildings with no food or support. She visited the city while the war continued and was able to rescue some children and arrange for them to be placed with local families. Realising an orphanage was needed, she would take a work force and materials from England, and received great support from the Fire Brigade in Aylesbury, many of whom gave up their holidays to refurbish what became the orphanage. Some years later, in Jane's retirement, Sri Lanka was devastated by the tsunami, so she flew there to offer help. This included raising more money to rebuild and extend an orphanage. Jane and Peter lived in Stone, firstly in Eythrope Road and then Lower Hartwell, before moving to Dinton where Jane held a charity coffee morning on the first Friday of each month. They then moved back to Stone. Everyone who knew Jane knew she was an inspirational woman and she will be sorely missed by her family and many friends.

BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COVID-19 TIER

Tier 2: High Alert

This is for areas with a higher or rapidly rising level of infections, where some additional restrictions need to be in place.

You must not socialise with anyone you do not live with or who is not in your support bubble in any indoor setting, whether at home or in a public place.

You must not socialise in a group of more than 6 people outside, including in a garden or a public space – this is called the 'rule of 6'.

Businesses and venues can continue to operate, in a Covid-secure manner, other than those which remain closed by law, such as nightclubs.

Pubs and bars must close, unless operating as restaurants. Hospitality venues can only serve alcohol with substantial meals.

Hospitality businesses selling food or drink for consumption on their premises are required to provide table service only, in premises which sell alcohol, close between 11pm and 5am (hospitality venues in airports, ports, transport services and motorway service areas are exempt) stop taking orders after 10pm. Hospitality businesses and venues selling food and drink for consumption off the premises can continue to do so after 10pm as long as this is through delivery service, click-and-collect or drive-through.

Early closure (11pm) applies to casinos, cinemas, theatres, museums, bowling alleys, amusement arcades, funfairs, theme parks, adventure parks and activities, and bingo halls. Cinemas, theatres and concert halls can stay open beyond 11pm in order to conclude performances that start before 10pm. Public attendance at outdoor and indoor events (performances and shows) is permitted, limited to whichever is lower: 50% capacity, or either 2,000 people outdoors or 1,000 people indoors. Public attendance at spectator sport and business events can resume inside and outside, subject to social contact rules and limited to whichever is lower: 50% capacity, or either 2,000 people outdoors or 1,000 people indoors.

Places of worship remain open but you must not socialise with people from outside of your household or support bubble while you are indoors there, unless a legal exemption applies.

Weddings and funerals can go ahead with restrictions on numbers of attendees – 15 people can attend wedding ceremonies and receptions, 30 people can attend funeral ceremonies, 15 people can attend linked commemorative events such as wakes or stone settings.

Organised outdoor sport, and physical activity and exercise classes can continue

Organised indoor sport, physical activity and exercise classes will only be permitted if it is possible for people to avoid mixing with people they do not live with (or share a support bubble with). There are exceptions for indoor disability sport, sport for educational purposes and supervised sport and physical activity for under-18s, which can take place with larger groups mixing.

You can continue to travel to venues or amenities which are open, but should aim to reduce the number of journeys you make where possible.

If you live in a tier 2 area, you must continue to follow tier 2 rules when you travel to a tier 1 area. Avoid travel to or overnight stays in tier 3 areas other than where necessary, such as for work, education, youth services, to receive medical treatment, or because of caring responsibilities. You can travel through a tier 3 area as a part of a longer journey.

CUDDINGTON & DINTON School News



As we approach the end of term it is amazing to look back to the beginning of it in September. We had a great start with the children adapting wonderfully on returning from holiday they were so excited to see their friends and enjoyed being back in school! Parents were most patient and understanding with the changes to pick-up and the many adjustments of



travelling times and logistics that had been made. With a rather higher than normal number of cars both here in Dinton as well as in Cuddington we have sought full co-operation from parents regarding care and consideration for our neighbours, children and staff when parking.

Amongst so many other adjustments we decided not to start school swimming lessons until further notice and there would be no dancing club on either site for the time being - just two examples of the knock-on effect of the virus which the children have adapted so well to in school.

Myself, our Governors and staff are very much aware of the changing situation regarding COVID-19 and lockdown measures in different areas of the country. We have fully shared and briefed our staff regarding what teaching arrangements would be should we go into a forced lockdown for either a class, a site or the whole school.

We celebrated harvest via zoom, accepted items for the Aylesbury Food bank and donated money to a charity of the children's choice. Rev Phil provided us with some great ideas to share with families and the churches have prepared a 'Harvest at Home' pack with activities and an Apple Crumble recipe. Routines have steadily become established and settled with children coping exceptionally well with the limitations to their movements around the building and at playtimes. A parent shared a poem that was written by a child during lockdown:

When 2020 Lockdown began,
The world was in a mess since I don't know when.
People got furloughed and lost their job,
Children stopped going to school, holding back sobs.
The NHS worked harder trying to save lives,
Numbers of COVID rising and rising to extreme heights.
But this did not stop us, because we are unbeatable,

Back in the classroom Year 6 had a practical science lesson looking at the heart and enjoyed a very interesting morning dissecting a lamb's heart, pictures of which made it to the school Twitter page! We looked forward to our first ever phone-call parents' evening and were delighted that it was so well received. Teachers felt they were able to share information about each child's progress and attainment in a focused way and parents seemed well pleased.

The staggered start and finish have worked well for the children and the arrangements for the end of the day allow everyone to socially distance – it is so important to keep all staff and children as safe as possible. We will not be wearing masks in school, only when we are 'off site' and/or having interactions with adults who don't work in the school. Children laid wreaths on both War Memorials the on the 11th November. This was done by Hamish and Emilia at Dinton Church, with a prayer read by Phoebe. We were joined by Nicky Bancroft and her daughter who read a poem to the year 5 & 6 children. The poem was written by her mother Diana Good about her war time experiences in Aylesbury and was most moving.

I am really pleased that we have been able to continue with the parents' Forum which such a helpful coming together, especially while there are so many sensitive issues going on around us with Covid-19. This time of year is usually hectic with the build up to Christmas events and activities – sadly much will be different but with a little creativity and imagination we are still going to be able to celebrate, but a little differently! There will be the **Infant Nativity** but this will be filmed and put on our website. It will stay live until 5th January 2021, so that you can share it with family and friends. All children in the video have permission to be filmed and there will also be **Christmas Surprise Shop**, **Christmas Tombola & Chocolate Mufti**, **Christmas Jumper Day**, **Christmas Fair** (online), **Children's hand-made gifts** and a **Christmas Quiz**! Unfortunately, we will be unable to hold our traditional Junior Carol service this year or the Junior games day. Finally, and before we get into all that the school managed to raise over £526 for Children in Need – a great achievement.
