FAREWELL TO CHLOE

In the recent Aylesbury Vale District Council elections, our councilor, Chloe Lambert, decided not to stand for re-election and stood down after a quarter of a century of working for the Parish. The Parish Council would like to thank Chloe for her fantastic record of service to the Parish during those years.

Chloe was a member of the Dinton with Ford and Upton Parish Council for 20 of those years, Chairman of the Parish Council for 8 years and a District Councillor for 12 years; she was also Chairman of the District Council in 2001 and Leader of the Independent Group on the Local Government Association during that time. Many major developments took place in the Parish while Chloe was chairing the Parish Council.

She negotiated with Hamish Currie—'Laird' of Dinton Hall at the time, to buy the 'old' playground from the family trust for £500, a major investment at the time, to enable the Parish to have its own playground. She subsequently led the negotiations for the purchase of the Parish field on behalf of the Parish Council.

Chloe chaired the Action Group which worked with the friend of Dinton School to keep the school open when threatened with closure. She also played a major role in the public enquiry into the future of Dinton Hall and the public enquiry which resulted in the footpath around the Biggin Pond. She also was very involved in the fight to retain the Dinton Hemit as a pub.

Being a Councillor involves receiving endless phone calls, sitting on numerous District Council Committees and attending meetings nearly every evening. Chloe has done all of these things without complaint and with immense good humour, for this, we are very grateful.

As for the future Chloe will continue to be involved in public service; she is a Magistrate, local president of the Alzheimer's Society, a member of the local British Legion Committee and will continue to write her weekly columns in the Bucks Herald. We also hope that she will continue to help and advise the Parish Council as she always has done. Thank you Chloe for your hard work and dedication.

The Parish Field And Spinney

Following the very successful wild-life hedge laying morning held in January under the guidance of Vale Countryside Volunteers, led by Paul Holton, the Parish Council organised another session in March. This time even more Parishioners turned up to help and a further section of the hedge was laid. We hope to finish the work in Autumn.

The hedge is being laid to improve views into the Parish Field and to create a more diverse habitat for wildlife.

David Hobden, the village tree warden has been very busy cutting and clearing dead wood in the Spinney and replanting with native species to help encourage greater wildlife diversity.

In early May the Parish Council organised a Spinney tidy up, to clear dead wood and litter. We also had concerns about the materials used by the boys to construct jumps for mountain biking. Many of the jumps were made from old pallets that were broken and a substantial number had large nails sticking out. All the

deadwood plus accumulated litter and pallets were all removed from the Spinney and burnt.

There are now substantial piles of logs in the Spinney and we would rather those be constructed as jumps than old pallets and doors.

Thank you to all the Parishioners who helped with the hedge laying and the tidy up. The Spinney is an area that is used by Parishioners and we hope that now it has been tidied up it will stay litter free.

'Rebecca Lyall is now working with Gregg and George to develop the plans and formulate detailed specifications and costs. Once these are in place, we can start applying for grants and raising the necessary funds to complete the work.'

The Old Playground

Work is well underway to formulate a detailed proposal for the old playground near the Parish Field. Once the old play equipment has been cleared, there will be considerable amount of space to be used for the benefit of the Parish. The younger children have a fantastic play area which is much used by children and their parents. It would be great to provide a space which could be equally well used and appreciated by the older children and youths of Dinton Ford and Upton.

A meeting was held in February to establish what the youths in the Parish would most like to see done in the Old playground, and a working party set up to move the project forward. Greg King and George Beavis started investigating what would be most popular with potential users of the space, and assisted by former Parish Councillor Rachel Johnson put together some designs and costs.

Greg and George presented their ideas to the Annual Parish Meeting and they were very well received.

The key factor for the youths is that the facilities should be aimed at teenagers. Adult concerns centre on security and potential for vandalism.

The most popular proposal is a mini ramp for skate boarding, along with a sports wall/play area for football and basketball, a cable way and a pendulum swing. Adults concerns would be addressed by lowering the hedge dividing the Playground with the main Parish field-improving visibility from the main road and children's play area.

'Some adult equipment such as a fitness trail could be used to encourage adults to use the area as well.'

Expansion of Aylesbury

Aylesbury Vale District Council have indicated that work may start in 2009 to build 9,000 new homes on Greenfield sites to the south of Aylesbury.

The development will stretch from the A41 Aston Clinton to the A418 Oxford Road. For those Parishioners who may wish to comment on the proposals AVDC say that there will be a consultation period from 17th July to 28th August.
