### Local Development Framework, Core Strategy and Allocated Sites

These two documents give an outline as to how the development of 9,600 new properties will effect the growth of Aylesbury and the surrounding area.

The Parish Council had several concerns about how these proposals would affect the Parish and the Parishioners.

We have therefore responded to the consultation by raising the following concerns: increased traffic flows on the A418 and C63 leading to increased noise and pollution, a lack of detail concerning educational provision both primary and secondary, flooding, adequate provision of water and electricity, protection of Designated Landscapes and public transport provision.

## Our Green Infrastructure

In early August the Parish Council was asked to put in its response to the Green Infrastructure Plan, one of the documents to be used in support of the Local Development Plan for Aylesbury Vale.

On your behalf we asked that the Areas of Attractive Landscape be preserved and extended, particularly in view of the current threat to green open spaces at Aylesbury posed by the Local Development Plan. We also asked that the Vale be provided with more designated bridle ways and safe cycle routes; encouragement for tree planting and where practical the establishment of more community woods; encouragement to preserve and replant hedgerows; the preservation of good agricultural land, floodplains and river areas; and more work on wildlife sites to preserve these against encroachment. And how about all schools appointing a Green Officer to promote the knowledge and protection of the countryside to the younger generation?

It is expected that the grant application for improvements to the Village Hall will receive a decision in October!

Meanwhile, the next fundraising event will be a Quiz Night on 10th November at 7:30pm.

## Waste Incineration Site At Haddenham

Bucks County Council have identified a site on the Haddenham Industrial Estate as one of six possible sites for the location of waste management facilities. At the moment, the preferred site in Aylesbury Vale is at Aston Clinton with the Haddenham site being identified as a 'reserve' site.

The Parish Council responded to a consultation document on the proposed Haddenham site by opposing the proposal in view of the impact of increased traffic movement to the site via the A418.

# The Parish Field And Spinney

Thank you to all who helped in the spring with the laying of the hedge bordering the Parish Field and Upton Road. We are holding another working party on October 31st under the direction of AVDC Green Spaces Officer, Paul Holton. The Vale Volunteers, under the direction of AVDC Green Spaces Officer Paul Holton, will be helping us but the more volunteers we have the more hedge we can lay, so if you would like to help please contact Diana Coole, Helen Wild or David Hobden. We will publish the dates for the hedge laying in the next Bigg Issue. David Hobden, the village tree warden, has been very busy cutting and clearing dead wood in the

Spinney and replanting with native species to help encourage greater wildlife diversity. David planted 125 saplings two years ago and they have made very good growth. During the winter David will be continuing to replant the newly cleared areas with another 150 saplings. The saplings are provided by AVDC with the Parish Council paying half the cost. We are concerned that there has been some vandalism of the planted saplings and we would ask those who use the spinney to take care and avoid the newly planted areas.

## The Old Playground

We have now had time to get more detailed plans and costs together for the Old Playground Project. The original idea was to provide a play area for the older children and teenagers of the Parish at the site of the Old Playground. The old and disused play equipment has been removed and the remaining space looked promising as a site for a skate ramp, multi use games area (known in the trade as MUGA), cableway and pendulum swing.

We have received quotes from a number of suppliers including specialist ramp designers, play area manufacturers and suppliers of more traditional playground equipment. The cost of these varies, but it has become obvious that we will not be able to install all the elements on the wish list for much less than £55,000.

In addition there are questions around the hedge enclosing the site and whether it needs removing for safety and access, as well as the issues of general access to the site. Some of the money needed can be raised from various grants, but a considerable amount will need to raised from parishioners. Although the initial response to the idea of a new leisure area from those who attended the Annual Parish Meeting was very positive, no-one knew at the time how much it was likely to cost. In addition, the issues surrounding access, security and environment had not been fully debated.

Before we take the proposals any further, those who live closest to the site also need to be consulted and given a chance to ask questions and air their views.

The Parish council will consider the installation of a skate ramp only, at a much lower cost than for the whole project. The other

ing children's playground, then problems with visibility and access will also be removed.

Rebecca will have detailed proposal - including costs and specification - for discussion at the parish council meeting on October 9th. The council would hope to reach a decision on whether or not to proceed at this meeting. We will invite all those who have an interest, neighbours, potential users, parishioners and fundraisers to attend the meeting and express an opinion. If you cannot attend please sed a letter or email to Keith Gray, Clerk to Parish Council so your opinion can be taken into consideration.
