#### **DOG BINS**

It is an offence not to pick up dog mess in public spaces. This includes the Parish Field, the walk to school route and other public areas. Please report anyone you see not picking up. Children play in the Parish Field and need safeguarding. Most dog owners are responsible but it is the few who are not who give all dog owners a bad name. A new bin has now been installed in Westlington Lane.



#### **DINTON VILLAGE HALL**

A dropped kerb has now been installed and a new fence has been erected to protect the children, also webbing over the grass is now down. Although the fete gave us £500 towards the cost of the work, it has still cost well over £2,000. The space now provided is not huge but

will enable several cars to park off road and during times, like the quiz night, when everyone leaves at the same time. Double parking could also be a possibility.

Maintenance works continue on the hall to keep it in the best possible condition. The old red chairs have been given to Ford Village Society, who have given us a donation of £50, which is gratefully accepted. In a joint effort with some residents of Ford, the red chairs were removed from the stage and then the new 100 padded chairs, which had been stored elsewhere, were transported to the village hall.

#### **School News**

At the beginning of February we were delighted to welcome Mrs Milly Soames DL to the school in her role of High Sheriff of Buckinghamshire. We invited her, not just because she lives in Cuddington, but it was just another chance for children to find out a bit more about important activities in the county.

Milly was shown round the Infant site by Headteacher, Mrs Price and the Junior site by Deputy Headteacher, Mr Tomson. Milly was really impressed to see how well the school was doing and what changes had taken place over the years since she had last been in the school.

She was able to see all the children in their classrooms and tell them a bit about what she did as High Sheriff. On the Junior site she met the School Council who asked questions and Milly explained that one of the key things she wanted to do as High Sheriff was to give support and encouragement to the various organisations that look after us – police, fire brigade, prisons and many others working in law and local government.



The day after the school was visited by

an adviser who we had invited in from the Diocese to take part in an evaluative review day. The day was approached as an official inspection would be and explored the strengths of the school and progress since our last Ofsted visit. We are delighted that our standards and outcomes are stronger than ever and many new outstanding features were found to be embedded in our practise - thank you to all the children and staff for their continued hard work.

It doesn't seem long ago that Breakfast Clubs were introduced on both Infant and Junior sites and these are already proving very popular. We are now in the process of introducing After School Clubs and, at this stage, the demand is such that this is just on the Infant site. Governors and the Management team are very keen to encourage and support this facility and we are hopeful that the Junior site can start one in September.
