### CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

# Cllr Martin Usherwood (Chairman of the Council) ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The past year has, for the Parish Council, been one of keeping aware of central initiatives and being up to date with local events against a climate of restricted budgets and devolved services.

My role as Chairman would not be possible without the support of the councillors and officers. For some this may be their last year of service and for others a landmark of long years of being a councillor; Jon Horn completed 20 years in October. Thus, my hearty thanks go to the council members; Larraine Gooch as Vice Chair, Jon Horn, Barbara Green, Honor Vane, Mel Kidner and Mike Henderson for all their input and help. Also to Mike Thompson as our Financial Officer for keeping a close watch on our finances as costs increase. My special thanks to Keith Gray as our Clerk without whom we would be in danger of deviating into difficulties at all levels. It is amazing how well he fulfils his role whilst doing his other duties. Our District Councillors, Judy Brandis and Brian Foster have kept us informed and acted on our behalf throughout the year as has Paul Irwin as our County Councillor; he is up for re-election in May.

A lot of energy and time has been spent in developing and conducting the Parish Survey, with the results delivered to every household in the Parish. The results based on a 30% response are interesting and informative whilst showing there are variances of opinion. My special thanks go to Mike Henderson for his expertise, time and energy as the lead person. Comments are all welcome and will be taken into account when we contemplate development of a Neighbourhood Plan. Such a plan is probably needed as some development will need to be accommodated even without the Aylesbury Vale Plan which is eagerly awaited anytime now. The Parish will change and develop and reflect the changing demographics of Parishioners. For example, we are presently waiting to hear the outcome of an application to build 175 houses at the junction of our Parish and Stone on the A418; 46 houses will be in this parish. This emphasises the need for Parishioners to comment to Aylesbury Vale DC when planning applications are made as their opinions are taken into account.

There have been some happy and some disappointing events in the year. The spinney and Parish field are looking in very good shape due to the hard work of our Tree Warden, David Hobden and Jon Horn, The playground has been refreshed with new swings and new surfacing. The great expense has in part been met by generous grants from the Fete, Dinton Beer Festival, The Community Chest, Haddenham Beer Festival and other groups and benefactors. We are very grateful to them all.

The June Tea Party for the Queen's 90th birthday was a lovely occasion and demonstrated all the best values of the Parish.

Sadly, we decided not to have a Bonfire Night event in light of concerns about insurance requirements, safety, and excessive potential numbers attending. We recognize that this will be a missed event.

On a positive note, we should record that Dinton now has a flourishing vineyard and a very enjoyable Beer Festival.

The devolved services agreement with Aylesbury Town Council is providing an

excellent service for Parish maintenance, grass cutting and keeping the villages looking tidy and thanks go to Steve Webb and his team. Unrelated is the fact that the number of Dog Bins have been increased to cater for the large number of dogs, including

those with professional dog walkers some of whom have been noted to allow fouling of the Parish Field.

New notices have been put to remind owners and walkers of their responsibilities to clear up dog mess.

The litter picks in Ford and Dinton produced depressingly large amounts of rubbish, so we are grateful to the volunteers who helped. Also to those who keep a watching brief as to the state of footpaths and stiles.

The forthcoming year looks to be a busy one with changes in the governance of Buckinghamshire in a single tier, work starting on HS2 and the resulting traffic effects

and a final Aylesbury Vale plan. These and other issues will keep us occupied and we will need your help.



Finally I thank Sylvia Eaton and Janet Morgan for helping to make this evening a success and to everyone for coming.

Last term the Junior choir sang at the Albert Hall - what a performance! They were amazing and it was an honour to be there and part of the whole experience! An enormous thank you to Miss Mitchell and Mrs Baker who have worked so hard with them and to Mrs Mitchell who led the children in the concert. In this final week of the term the children had been thinking about

the meaning of Easter. The Easter Celebration event in St Peter and St Paul in Dinton was very contemplative for the Junior children. They visited different areas within the church and were led by volunteers and clergy to think about specific aspects of the Easter story - it was a very moving experience for the adults and the children were very thoughtful in their responses. As ever, they behaved impeccably. In the afternoon the Infants came to the Junior site and had an Easter party, again hosted by volunteers and clergy. We were overwhelmed by the support and time given to the children on the day from all involved. As part of our on-going programme to support parents, we have been running a series of workshops and evening sessions. These have proved most popular and useful. Tickets £5 and all profits go to the Library.


