DINTON ANNUAL BEER FESTIVAL

The third Dinton Annual Beer Festival was held this year in the gardens of the Seven Stars community owned pub in Dinton on Saturday 19th August. The weather was fine and dry and a large crowd enjoyed the afternoon sampling the twelve varieties of real ales on offer, together with a range of ciders and the Pimm's



Entertainment was provided by the colourful Owlswick Morris Dancers, accompanied by their barn owl mascot Ellie and during the afternoon live American Old Time music was provided by the band. Steph ran a separate barbecue throughout the afternoon. A big thank you goes to all those who supported us on the day, the many village volunteers who helped set up and run the event and of



course the very generous sponsors, without whom the day wouldn't happen.

This year the festival raised the sum of £1400 which will be split equally with £700 going to the Village Hall Committee as a contribution to a much needed refurbishment of the Village Hall kitchen and £700 going towards the purchase of a community owned defibrillator.



The Celebration Evening was a very pleasant affair with a good turn out of people enjoying the refreshments provided..

The main purpose of the evening was to hand out cheques to people who had requested our help with a project from the profits from this year's fete.

A representative from each outlined how they hoped to spend the money. Andy McCrea gave a very enlightening explanation of the future positioning and use of a defibrillator which is to be sited at the 7 Stars

He is planning an evening of practice on CPR and use of the defibrillator if anyone needs help. Someone raised the point about how hard to press on chests of elderly people. Andy caused much laughter by suggesting that "if someone was already dead it would be an ideal time to practice!" One person hoped it wouldn't be her! On a more serious note It was stressed that we need more committee members. We think some people feel it is too onerous for them to undertake, but in fact we only

meet once a month starting in February. Yes, more meetings may need to be held nearer the date of the fete. We meet, usually, in the pub, and it is a very sociable evening. Please volunteer if you want the fete to carry on.

Planning is already under way for next August Bank Holiday Sunday's fete and we look forward to seeing everybody there.



HIRING THE PARISH FIELD - What are the procedures?

The field is legally owned by the parish council and it is the parish council who is responsible for its upkeep and all the regulations connected with land ownership, public access, health & safety etc. The field is not an event arena but a field deemed for use by the local community/parish residents. To book the parish field, and in order for the parish council to be covered by correct insurance, it is a requirement that all those wishing to use the field complete a form.



It may also be necessary for the Clerk to cancel your hire or restrict the use of the field for parking vehicles due to weather or other conditions making the field unsuitable for parking, private or community use. Please note that your application must be received by the Clerk one month before the hire date. A refundable deposit of £250.00 is required with every application. The field will be checked after your hire to ensure it is left in a good condition. We advise that you check the hire agreement terms relating to the hire of the field and the deposit. We try to be as accommodating as we can and we also allow the field to be used by the church as a car park when they have weddings—this is to stop vehicles being parked on village roads and impacting on local residents.

To discuss the use, and hire, of the field you can speak to any parish councillor or contact the Clerk, who is responsible for issuing the form and ensuring the field is adequate for your proposed use.

Using WhatsApp, within seconds of sending the image I had confirmation from my brother, who incidentally was born in the cottage, that the house

on the left, Ostler's cottage, was ours. It was a special moment for all of us, especially my Mother who came in on the 'chat'.

Then I explored your beautiful village and came across the coffee morning. I was welcomed into Angela's home and to a feast of British cakes. Everyone was extremely warm to me and a poignant moment came when Trish and Honor introduced me to Gwen Woodford. She remembered my parents and my father Michael Baker, from more than half a century earlier when he was a young vet with Anderson and Bugg.

Thank you to the ladies of Dinton who made my visit to the village so special. My Mother and I are hoping to visit the village fete next year.



Dinton Open Golf Championship

A twenty-one-man rabble gathered at Studley Wood Golf Club on Friday 29th September for the renewal of the twice-yearly competition to establish The Dinton Open Golf Champion. The event was used as a further fund-raising opportunity towards the Dinton Village Defibrillator Project.

The golf course was in splendid condition set among the rolling Oxfordshire countryside with all manner of wildlife scampering about creating a scene of wondrous autumn colour and nature. The competitors by comparison were more alcoholic than bucolic as they attempted to shake off the previous night's excesses before swinging wildly on the Tee. Reigning champion, Fraser Stewart, recent star of BBC Breakfast



Time and Radio's 4 and 5, look fit enough as the morning drizzle rolled off his ample parting but having been docked 2 shots on his handicap a repeat victory was judged as slim.

The competitors waited with some trepidation for the appearance of 'ringer' Pete Green, a three handicap, unknown quantity, and mate of 'Dandy' Dan, who himself lacked nothing in confidence although as it proved sadly lacking in ability.

The draw was made and O'Driscoll, Merry and Taylor marched to the first Tee to get proceedings underway. Three double bogeys later suggested the winner may not be coming from this group. Seven three balls attempted to get their Yellow Ball home for the team event while the Open Champion was decided in an individual Stableford format playing off full handicap. Clubhouse mutterings that John' King's 36 handicap was far too generous (he has been seen taking private coaching in recent weeks) were misguided as his balls felt the autumn cold of the many lakes on the course. It's a brave man that takes a swim this time of year!

The Par 3 eighth hole encouraged players to get as close to the pin as they could with their drive with a magnificent prize for the nearest. For most a 'nearest the green' would have been more appropriate but 'ringer' Green guided his missile to within 5 feet of the pin as mutterings from other competitors confirmed their darkest thoughts!

The magnificent 18th hole featured the Longest Drive competition with the proviso that the drive must finish on the fairway to count. Most competitors could not even see the fairway let alone hit it but Terry Loughlin, no doubt aided by Storm Ophelia, conjured up a 280 metre 'special' to scoop the honour. As teams completed their rounds, scorecards handed in and excuses spewed forth from the lips of most, beer began to flow freely and rumour spread that indeed 'ringer' Green had played a faultless round. 'The Committee' finally announced the scores and indeed 'The Pro' had prevailed with an impressive 38 Stableford score to lift the magnificent 'Crossed Golf Club' trophy that so many aspired to. Three teams managed to get their Yellow Ball home with Frank Kelleher's team having the highest points score to lift the prize of several bottles of wine. This result is still subject to a 'Committee Enquiry' as unconfirmed reports of a pot of yellow paint found later in Frank's golf bag are investigated. After the championship the competitors retired to The Seven Stars Dinton for a fish and chip supper and more fun. There were suggestions that most of the golfers should actually retire from the game or we should take the Defibrillator with us for the next renewal of the event!

£200 pounds was raised towards the Defibrillator and a great night was had by all as Steph, landlady of The Seven Stars, laid on a great feast.

So, it is now down to Pete Green, as defending champion, to organize the next renewal in the spring of 2018.

Any would be golfers or drinkers are welcome to join the Dinton Golf Society and take part in future events. It would be great to see some ladies join the society, most of the competitors had to make their own cup of tea before Tee-off.
