The school participated in Christian Aid Week with a series of assemblies throughout the week on the theme of helping others. During the week children brought money to throw into the "wishing wells" that had been made on each of the school's sites.

All of our pupils across the school spent time working with an artist making wooden owls. The children learnt new skills and are thrilled with the finished products that stand proudly on both sites.

Year 2 pupils took part in a tag rugby festival were they had coaching in the morning and a mini-tournament in the afternoon at Aylesbury Rugby Club. The team came second in their group.

Having invested a great deal on the inside of the buildings, the playground has now had a complete make over. Re-rganisation of the sheds and some tidying up followed by re-surfacing and painting of the play area has improved the area no end. We now have a wonderful space marked out for netball, short tennis and six a side football.

This service is for household waste only. If you have bulky items that you cannot transport to our collection site, we can collect from your home for free. See our website or call the number below for details.

We are sorry but the village refuse freighter cannot accept:

- Any electrical items
- Clinical waste e.g. Syringes', used dressings
- Car parts including tyres, exhausts, batteries, oil
- Hazardous waste e.g. Asbestos
- Commercial or business waste
- Building rubble
- Paints, liquids or garden chemicals

CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

The Chairman of the Parish Council gave her report at the Annual Meeting of the Parish. Residents of the parish and visitors attended the meeting including District Councillors, Chairman and Vice-Chairman of Coldharbour Parish Council, and guest speakers Sarah Allwood (Community Projects Officer for Buckinghamshire Community Action) and Beverley Trevitt (Outreach Officer for Buckinghamshire Community Foundation). She stated that these are strange and unsettling times nationally, and that she was very happy to recommend a Parish Council which focuses on serving its community well and ensuring value for money. Cllr Coole stated that the council continued to voice its strong opposition to development in the southern arc around Aylesbury since the council believes a major housing project in this sector will impact seriously upon our quality of life. A project this year which has at last been brought to completion is the new sports wall in the old children's playground, and thanks for all their hard work are due to Cllrs Lyall and Owen, and of course to WREN who provided funding for the equipment. She stated that traffic issues continued to concern the parish councillors and that the council highlighted dangers we believed were posed by the Cuddington crossing on the A418. This resulted in better signage and long distance visibility of the central refuge. Further representations to the

County Council concerning the safety of the C63 past the school in icy weather at last resulted in a reassessment of the terrain, and the road was duly added to the gritting schedule. We've been trying for this for many years! We remain concerned for the safety of residents, particularly children, crossing the A418 at the top of New Road. A great deal of work has been done both by the Parish Council and by the Ford Village Society to promote driving within the speed limit in Ford village, and the police have been active both in that location and outside the School, where parking by parents is a perennial problem. She commended all the police help received in this connection. The Council was grateful to receive a BCC Community Leaders' Fund grant of £2350 towards any agreed proposal for traffic calming in Ford. These proposals are currently being investigated.

Cllr Lyall has now been appointed to the Cuddington & Dinton School governing body. It was reported that concerns raised from residents living in Westlington regarding the noise from the bird scarers in the fields to the west of the village had been taken up with AVDC's Environmental Health department and with our District Councillor.

Residents should continue to ring Highways on Call to report pothole issues on the roads. A new eight year contract has now been awarded by Buckinghamshire County Council; the successful appointee is Ringway Jacobs.

The antique fire engine remains in the care of Milton Keynes Museum. The door to the Fire engine shed has been renewed, and the council was grateful to the Fete Committee and to the Marquee Group for a donation of funds towards the cost of this. The War Memorial in Ford has also been renovated, and again thanks are due to a generous parishioner. A kind gift from Mr and Mrs Trotman is a quantity of antique maps which show field plans and settlements around the area. These are now in the possession of the Clerk for safekeeping. Special thanks are also due to parishioners for the splendid turnout for this year's Litter Pick. Parish Councillors continued to undergo training, dealt with 35 planning applications, attended meetings on resident's behalf such as the Haddenham and Long Crendon Local Area Forum, Neighbourhood Action Group, and special interest focus groups. And in addition they and a number of residents undertook further work on hedge laying, tree planting and clearing a section of the Chestnut Avenue so that a safe path could be maintained for walkers and children using this route after school. She wished a speedy recovery to our tree warden, David Hobden who was unable to be at the meeting. She thanked the Councillors and Clerk, for their very hard and conscientious work over the last year.

FORD VILLAGE SOCIETY—ROAD MANAGEMENT

The Parish Council are continuing to work with Ford Village Society to reduce speeding through Ford Village. Options are currently being examined and further costing details sought from Bucks County Council. The Police have issued speeding fines in Ford and will continue to work with parishioners on speed reduction strategies.

LITTER PICK

The Parish Council would like to thank all those parishioners who so kindly turned out to take part in the annual litter picks held in Dinton and in Ford in March. This year we had a mystery helper, who early in the morning, before anyone else arrived, managed to collect no less than five sacks of litter between Dinton Church and Four Winds Cross Roads. Our grateful appreciation to all of you!
