ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The annual parish meeting will be held on:
10th April 2018 at 7pm
Dinton Village Hall

There will be no Guest Speaker this year but we will hear from the Chairman of the Parish Council as well as representatives from community groups in the parish

Broadband in the Parish - The upgrade of broadband connections to a reasonably acceptable level continues to be a problem in parts of the Parish. Since responsibility for funding the subsidised Connected Counties superfast rural broadband rollout programme was passed to Aylesbury Vale District Council in 2016, AVDC has contributed a miserly £250,000 to upgrading broadband. By comparison AVDC allocated up to £1,536,000 to form a company to supply fibre broadband direct to homes in a small number of villagers around Oving. This company is thought to have connected only 234 homes, before collapsing, at a staggering cost to council tax payers of £5,000 per home.

The latest information from BT is that they will be upgrading cabinets 2,7,8 and 9 on the Stone Exchange by September 2018. This will cover Ford, parts of Upton and areas along the A418 between Dinton and Stone. Cabinet 1 has been deemed impossible to upgrade and is scheduled to be replaced with FTTH (fibre direct to home) in 2019. The good news for those that are not included the current upgrade plans is that the Government is legislating for a USO (Universal Service Obligation) by 2020. Broadband providers will be obliged by law to provide a minimum of 10Mbps download and 1Mbps upload speed on application. You will be required at some point in time to register your requirement, it will not be supplied automatically. If you need any more information, please contact: barrylynch@dinton.info.

Come suited & booted for whatever the weather for a 90 minute walk in the countryside On alternate Wednesdays – throughout the year from:


Methodist Chapel, Eythrope Road - STONE - Wednesday 14th - 28th March

Dinton Churchyard Tidy

Spring will soon be here and once again the Churchyard Working Party will be trying to keep Dinton Churchyard tidy over the Spring, Summer and Autumn. Can you spare a little time to help keep the churchyard tidy? The more helpers we have the easier it becomes. The next working party will be on Saturday 14th April, 10.30am until 12.00 noon, with refreshments provided. Then, normally on the 2nd Saturday of every month through to October. The work consists of light gardening tasks, mowing, weeding, strimming and general tidying up; tools can be provided but it would be useful if you can bring your own.
