Seeing is Believing

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb.

John 20:1-18

These words start one of the most dramatic passages in the bible. The story of the women going to the tomb and finding it empty.

Elsewhere in this edition I write about the book '*Who moved the Stone?*' which is a Christian classic. I mentioned it reads like a good detective book. The central point is in the title. The women would not have been able to roll a large stone, the other friends were too frightened and dismayed to do anything much. If anyone else had removed Jesus' body they could have produced it, when the rumours started about him. If the women had gone to the wrong tomb then the mistake would have been pointed out. If Jesus had been unconscious not dead he would have not been strong enough to move the stone, which was guarded by soldiers. Seeing the empty tomb they believed.

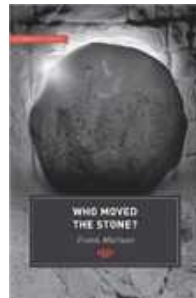

Who Moved the Stone?

This book was first published in 1930 and it remains a favourite Christian classic. I first read it fifty years ago and recently have reread the book. It was written by Albert Henry Ross using the pseudonym Frank Morison. He started with the intention of writing a book showing the Easter story was made up and unbelievable. As a result of his analysis of the various accounts in the different gospels he concluded the story was factual.

It is a detailed account but the style is straightforward. It reads like a book from the golden age of detective stories. G. K. Chesterton's was sent a copy and he remarked that he picked the book up "under the impression that it was a detective story" and found that the case for the resurrection was "treated in such a logical and even legal manner."

Many people have become a Christian after reading the book or had their faith strengthened.



The History of Pizza Making in Stone and Dinton

Not many people have heard of the cottage industry making pizzas in Bucks in the last century and before. The dough was mined locally and then hand prepared in special distilleries.

The first day of this month features the annual pizza race when local housewives run from Upton to Dinton with fresh baked pizzas. Men were first allowed to race in 1967 but so far no men have bothered to.

Letter from Aston Sandford

Excerpts from an eulogy given at Jim Walker's funeral in Aston Sandford church with around 100 people in attendance on 12/2/2026.



James William Walker was born in Longwick over 90 years ago the youngest of 6 with 5 elder sisters. He attended the Longwick school until the age of 8. He left Lord Williams' after School Certificate with a full clutch of passes and decided to join the sawmilling business in Longwick at his father's sawmill.

Meeting Eleanor Good (of this Parish) during his Young Farmer days led to winning a debating cup together and then marriage in 1960. At that point they moved into Rose Farm in Longwick and were there for nearly 60 years before moving to Thame in 2018. Dad worked hard and ensured that he always had a decent motor car to undertake the mileage that accompanied the timber trade starting with a Sunbeam Talbot 90 and running through his beloved Jaguar XK 140 (cited as his favourite car of all time) through to an early E type, a Jaguar Mk 2 and an Aston Martin DB6 – you will be getting the picture here.

Rose Farm was busy hub of energy with a continual flow of people and there was always something going on around the kitchen table.

Dad was known for his business acumen and was invited on to the Swanbourne prep school board of Governors. He served 25 years on the board and retired after 15 years as the Chair.

As we grew up Rose Farm was a place where people always seemed welcome although usually called upon to bring in the geese or move animals. Parties were held and sleeping bags and blankets found for those in need.... Mum was always keen to be the hostess for whoever we brought home.

Mum and Dad enjoyed being social and thrived on the friendships they found playing tennis, Bridge and on the shooting fields too. Their life was one of hard work and success, a long and eventful marriage resulting in 4 sons and now 11 grandchildren. We can all remember him in our own way but I will remember the intellect, gentle sense of humour and a twinkle which he retained to the end.

Talking to people about Dad I was offered some terms to describe him – 'Legend', 'top bloke' and importantly 'Straight up guy' – everyone knew where they stood with Jim.

Born James, mostly referred to as Jim, (unexplainedly Elephant at Lord Williams), Jimbo, Dragfly 32 in the RAF, we sons were lucky enough to be able to call him Dad, and his Grandchildren know him as Grumpy.

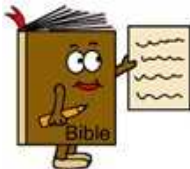

Gymnastics, football, swimming competitions, netball, dance and tennis have all been enjoyed this first half term which ended with a non-uniform day when donations were made to Buckinghamshire Mind charity.

It was Children's Mental Health Week, with a focus on supporting children to express their feelings and understand the importance of looking after their wellbeing. Donations will help the charity continue its valuable work within our local community. Cross curricular themes have been explored in the classrooms with a 'Maths in Art' project when pupils explored how maths appears in patterns, symmetry, shapes and tessellations. It is good to see them confidently applying mathematical ideas in different contexts. A selection of the creative and thoughtful pieces are now on the school website.

The Department of Education is closely monitoring attendance records in all schools as it is useful in understanding how attendance impacts learning. In the season of colds and coughs it is sometimes difficult to decide whether a child is well enough to attend school so a NHS poster 'Should I keep my child off school' has been shared with parents.

u3a General Meeting at Haddenham Village Hall

Tuesday 14th April 2026 @ 2.30pm
Modernism in Metroland
Speaker: Alison Bailey

Metroland architecture was typically conservative with a strong leaning to the “Tudorbethan” style for housing and shops. An exception is “High and Over”, a Grade 2* modernist building in Amersham, built between 1929 and 1931.

Marketing went into full gear with Metro-land magazines promoting an idyllic country lifestyle, with beautiful homes, within easy reach of London. From the end of World War 1 through the 1920s, Metroland boomed as London’s new middle class took advantage of affordable mortgages.
