STONE LOCAL HISTORY GROUP

TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY – 1999-2019

On June 18th current members, guests and old friends gathered in Stone Village Hall to celebrate just over 20 years of the History Group. First Chairman Ann Littlewood was there to cut a magnificent cake and Michael Lunts put on a special performance for us before a delicious supper.



It all started with a well attended 10 week WEA course at Stone Methodist Chapel in September 1998 – “The Village of Stone – Change and Continuity 1800 – 1900”, Using a wide variety of sources ranging from newspapers, directories and church records to maps and census returns, we explored some of the aspects of Stone’s history and development, and decided that we should form a group to do further research on family and village history, the Hartwell Estate and its part in the development of the settlement - and anything else we could dig up

The first meeting of the Stone Local History Group was in February 1999 at the Chapel with Ann Littlewood as Chairman, Joan Shurvell Treasurer and Sylvia Sherwood Secretary and archivist, following up stories and collecting material. As today, we had a monthly speaker and arranged walks and visits, exploring local villages and further afield.

Since then we have had a steady membership of 80+, have listened to more than 200 talks, all recorded in monthly newsletters, enjoyed over 50 outings ranging from Oxford to Lord’s Cricket Ground, London walks to Bletchley Park and put on many exhibitions, from Sylvia’s massive exhibition in hall, church and school in 2002 to displays at the annual Bucks Local History conferences since 2000.

Last year’s hugely successful exhibition on the village in WWI attracted around 650 people and we are repeating it this year on Sunday November 10 – a last

chance to see the displays, artworks and artefacts, and have lunch or tea.



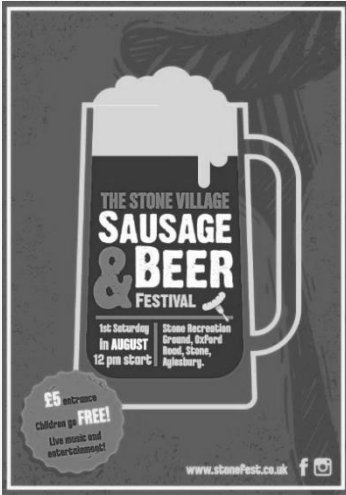

We now have a huge archive and put on numerous smaller displays at village fetes and events. In the early years many of us contributed to the Stone Village Design Statement and we have run competitions and liaised with the school in many ways.

We still meet regularly at the Village Hall, with excellent speakers on a wide variety of local and national history, and already have a good programme for 2020. You can come as a guest for £2. The next meeting is Tuesday Sept 17 with Julian Hunt on the History of Aylesbury.

This year we have produced our first calendar – early photographs of Stone and surrounding villages pre WWI – it's selling well.

The Pyramidal Orchid



A highly distinctive wildflower with a pyramid shaped head of bright pink flowers. The colour, however, can range from deep magenta to pure albino white. Occasionally the individual flowers in the spike occur upside down. The pyramidal orchid was chosen as the County Flower of the Isle of Wight, where it abounds on the islands chalk landscape. Like many orchids, it requires a specific fungus to be present in the soil in order to bloom.

Originally a flower of old, semi-natural chalk and limestone grasslands, the pyramidal orchid has shown a penchant for more artificial environments in recent times. Colonies have appeared along motorways and ring-roads, canals, marinas and even at one time at Stansted airport.

The scientific name *Anacamptis* comes from a Greek word meaning 'bend forward', while the Latin name *Pyramidalis* refers to the pyramidal shape of the inflorescence.

With everything else going on I have managed to submit all my essays and coursework to complete my second year of Curacy training and in September I begin my final year of training so for now Joy and I are looking forward to a trip to Malta shortly for a rest by the sea with some sunshine for a change!

My Pilgrimage to Santiago for Cancer Research



Recently I completed in five consecutive days the 76 km of the Camino Ingles Pilgrimage from A Coruna on the Northern coast of Spain to the Cathedral in Santiago. During the walk, guided by the Camino sign posts illustrating the traditional scallop shell emblem, I had my Credential booklet stamped in cafes and hostleries along the trail as proof of my journey. The local Spanish people in the villages I passed through were friendly and encouraging. The weather was kind with a maximum temperature of 16 C, ideal for walking and there was very little rain. The trail was mainly easy walking apart from some long climbs through eucalyptus woods.

Following the final day of my trek I queued with hundreds of other pilgrims to receive a Camino de Santiago Certificate of Achievement. Pilgrims over a wide age range and nationalities gathered from many different Camino directions, some having

walked great distance across other parts of Spain and European countries. The whole atmosphere was a buzz and at the age of 76 I was quite pleased with my own modest result. I had actually walked 90 km in total carrying a rucksack weighing over 6 kg.

Later that day among many other pilgrims I visited the Cathedral where the bones of St. James the Apostle were buried. It was a pity the inside was in a state of renovation with sheets of polythene everywhere, but the outside was rather splendid.

I wish to thank everyone who has supported my sponsored walk for Cancer Research UK. Any donations still to come are payable to me. Letter from Aston Sandford



This year's Ride+Stride event organised by Buckinghamshire Historic Churches Trust is on **Saturday 14th September**, and it is an event well worth supporting.

I say this not just because I am a Trustee but because our church has benefitted from grants from the Trust (as have others in the Wychert Vale Benefice) AND has benefitted considerably over the years from the event itself. On the day Riders and Striders - cyclists, horse riders and walkers - get sponsorship to visit as many places of worship as possible between 10:00am and 6:00pm, while others get sponsorship to sit in churches to welcome visitors. Half of the sponsorship money (and half of the the gift aid) raised goes to the Trust and half to the church of choice. In the last two years alone Aston Sandford Church has raised £654 each for itself and for the Trust just by having a couple of riders and a rota of sponsored sitters in the church.

Ride+Stride in 2018 raised an amazing £31,048 overall. Why not help to make even more money for this worthy cause this year? You never know when your church may need a grant for example for urgent repairs or a roof alarm. And for the Riders and Striders it is of course it is a great way to see so many of the truly lovely churches and chapels which we are lucky enough to have in Bucks.

August Gardening

For whatever the reason “seasons” do seem to be getting earlier, and certainly this year and last year they are also very dry and hot. This makes gardening more difficult especially in sandy areas, but never the less there are always plenty of jobs to do.

Rambler roses as they finish flowering need all the flowering shoots cut off at ground level and the new shoots tying in. Interestingly the same actions need carrying out on loganberries, blackberries and similar plants as soon as they finish fruiting. If more plants are needed, take cuttings about 12 inches long push into the ground, somewhere out of the way they generally root easily. Also one sometimes find a shoot has rooted, if this has happened cut the stalk and plant the root where needed.

Now we are in the holiday season do pick peas and beans before going away, move any plants in movable containers to a shady spot and if possible find a wonderful neighbour to water hanging baskets and green houses.

Onions will be ready for harvest, but do make sure they have completely died down before lifting and storing.

August is a good month to take cuttings of geraniums, heathers and fuchsias, place them around the edge of a flower pot, keep them in the shade and just moist.

In a few weeks they have rooted and can be potted singularly. Looking back over many years I do not remember so much growth on trees and shrubs, nor on my insect-eating plants!

“We’re all going on a Summer Holiday.”

This is a line from "Summer Holiday" which was a song recorded by Cliff Richard and The Shadows from the film of the same name, and was released as a single from the film in February 1963. It went to number one in the UK Singles Chart for a total of three weeks. The Shadows' instrumental "Foot Tapper" - also from the same film - took over the top spot for one week, before "Summer Holiday" returned to the top spot for one further week. The record is one of Richard's best known songs and was one of six hits Richard performed at his spontaneous gig at the 1996 Wimbledon Championships when rain stopped the tennis.

I wonder if I ought to pause there and explain what a “hit” was or a “single”. If you are of a certain age you might not know. Both words produce images of the 60s.

The film itself is quite interesting as it features a bus. The plot basically is some young men who repair buses decide to go on holiday by bus. Why not? It was the original busman’s holiday. They convert an old bus into a mobile home. The film makers in fact purchased three old buses, (RT2305 (KGU334), RT2366 (KGU395), and RT4326 (NLE990)) from London Transport and they were all converted to look like RT1881 (with a fake registration number: WLB991) so they could be used for filming different segments. The RT was the classic red London bus. The opening scenes were filmed at Aldenham Works, Elstree in 1962 during the depot’s annual Summer shutdown. The holiday scenes surprisingly were not filmed in Hertfordshire but in Greece.
