News from Aston Sandford

Coronation events

On Sunday 7th May Aston Sandford celebrated the Coronation with a well-attended picnic lunch in the thatched barn at The Old Rectory. The weather was kind so we had drinks outside, and the children were able to run around the Old Rectory's grounds. And while we were toasting the King in champagne the Church bells were rung as part of Ring for the King. The next day, volunteering day, we organised a churchyard working party (to tidy up particularly around the graves and the front and side walls of the churchyard), and two teams of litter pickers. The litter pickers worked their way down our own lane but more particularly picked from the hump backed bridge along what is called by Bucks Council the Risborough Road to the A4129 and then along to the parish boundary at Green Lane. The litter picking was brilliantly organised by Sue Belgrove and in total over 40 bin bags of rubbish were collected, and taken away by the Council. In addition to the usual kind of carelessly chucked litter there were two cat's eyes, or rather those parts of the cat's eye which are hidden in the road, and a 5 foot wide double glazed window, which was 'upcycled' from the pile of bags before the Council could collect the rubbish! Altogether a successful morning's work, and huge thanks to everyone involved, and particularly to Sue, for their hard work.

Annual Parochial Church Meeting

Our APCM was held on the evening of 24th May, again in the thatched barn at the Old Rectory, chaired by the Rev Cassa Messervy. Nick Morgan and Laura Macpherson were re-elected Church wardens, and I was re-elected as Treasurer. As ever there was an interesting and wide ranging discussion. Two dates to note –

- The church will be open on the afternoon of Saturday 14th October to enable people to see the church decorated for our Harvest Festival which will take place at 11 00am the following day;
- There will be no Remembrance Day service on Sunday 12th November, but instead Remembrance will be celebrated on Sunday 19th November.

Interment of ashes

On the afternoon of 10th June Gwen Barton's ashes were interred in the churchyard in a short service taken by the Ven Gordon Kuhrt.

The Dover Family

Some of my faithful readers will remember that in March and May 2018 I wrote two articles on the Dover family who lived at the Manor for much of the 19th century and many of whom are buried in our churchyard; there is a plaque to the head of the family, John Dover, above the font. Since then a couple of members of the family, descendants of that branch of the family which emigrated to Argentina, have been in touch with me, and in May this year I met three members of the family for the first

time, three sisters, one of whom lives in London, who had visited Aston Sandford a few years ago, and two from Buenos Aires. To my surprise they brought me a gift to thank me for all my work and in particular for finding out things about their ancestors of which they had no idea. It was such a pleasure to meet them.


Summer time holiday packing

On the verge

I was right about one thing recently. As soon as I started writing about roadsides which were left to grow during "no mow May", they were cut down! Leaving verges uncut has been controversial as many road junctions became difficult to use because the vegetation was so long it was hard to see oncoming traffic, but on the other hand the uncut flowers and grasses provide food and cover for pollinators and wildlife

These roadside spaces are refuges for many rare meadow wildflowers, which is crucial since the UK has lost 97% of its meadows since the 1930s. Verges cover an enormous area in the UK - they span about 500,000 kilometres, equivalent to driving more than 12 times around the Earth! Their total area is thought to be slightly larger than the Lake District National Park.

The roadside verges are an important habitat for a range of flora, including rare wildflowers. About 700 different species of wildflower can be found growing on verges, including 29 of the country's 52 species of orchid... Animals that reside on verges range from small insects and amphibians, to larger reptiles, mammals and birds, which rely on verges as a corridor connecting areas of undamaged habitat.



Leaving verges uncut and even better not using weed

killer on them is comparatively recent. Motorway and other main road verges used to be mown but financial restrictions killed off the weed killer. Perhaps the most

important thing is the verges, especially on motorways are kept free of people.



Where do you stand on verges? Not too close to the road I hope.

Interesting people who have lived in Stone no 8

Stone's Ernest Woodford, part 1, Methodist minister, missionary to India and survivor of a torpedo attack:

George Ernest Woodford was born in Stone in 1873, oldest of George and Annie Woodford's 10 children. (In this 1930s family picture he is third from the left, on the back row). As he grew up, he became increasingly involved in the Eythrope Road Methodist Church and eventually trained for the ministry, entering in 1898.



After more training at Richmond he spent 25 years or more working as a missionary for the Santals in Bengal, India, where he achieved a great deal both in the church and in developing education, welfare and medical services, fearlessly facing problems and setbacks, including shooting predatory bears! He was "a man of extraordinary courage"

He brought his family back to England during WW1 and a few weeks before the war ended, he left England again to return to Bengal – this time leaving his wife Daisy and children in Four Oaks, Birmingham. He sailed from Plymouth on HMS Tasman on September 14, together with 145 other men – judges, sea captains, medical men and academics.

Two days later the passengers were having tea when the ship was torpedoed off Ushant and sank in just 4 minutes. The crew of 14, who were all lost, had just time to launch the lifeboats and order all overboard and the passengers battled through heavy, icy, oily seas to the boats, where they spent a miserable night — Ernest rowed for hours "to keep warm and fight the mountainous seas" The tiller was smashed. The only food was a gulp of water "and one ship's biscuit…as hard as bricks and my poor new teeth refused to accept mine, so I broke off a piece and sucked it…". At 7.30 next morning they saw smoke on the horizon and were rescued by the USA SS Talbot, warmed, fed, and returned to Plymouth. 3 days later George arrived back home to the surprise of his family, breakfasting at Four Oaks, had a hot bath and slept for 2 days! Needless to say he was on the next boat to India with his dedicated companions.





HMS Tasman, above, and the rescue ship, USS Talbot. This was the 53rd successful attack by Uboat Kapitan/Leutnant Leo Hillebrand on his last patrol run. The survivors of the Tasman had a glimpse of the conning tower of his submarine SMU46 submerging as they fought the heavy seas.

Ernest later wrote a long and detailed report of his experience —a riveting read. During the long cold night he gave his blanket to a shivering Indian graduate, K M Panikar, returning home from Oxford. This man, K M Panikkar, became a highly respected historian, nationalist, politician and diplomat in India, taking part in the Round Table Conferences in 1930 and 1931, held in advance of Independence in 1947.

Ernest was very proud of being in at the start of the United Protestant church of South India, established in August 1947, a month after Independence.

He retired from India in the mid-twenties, but retained his interest in India and his missionary contacts all his life. In 1939 the Woodfords bought Stairways, Stone, from Lady Margaret Lamb and Lady Mary Packenham (nee Longford) for £700 – they had inherited it from their mother, widow of the 5th Lord Longford. This had been two estate workers cottages built in1832, knocked together and from 1929-1939 part of the Peverel Court estate. An extra kitchen and bathroom were added by Daisy for family evacuees during WWII - she was reluctant to share!



The traditional Common Prayer service takes place out of doors, in front of Hartwell Church. This spectacular and romantic mid-18th-century church is built in the 'Gothic' style. The church was built between 1753 and 1755 to a design by Henry Keene for Sir William Lee. It has two towers and sits in the landscaped grounds of Hartwell House, now a luxurious country hotel. Henry Keene

designed the church for Sir William Lee. It is octagonal with east and west towers, and is thought to echo the chapter house at York Minster.
