Holiday Time

In the UK, roughly 84% of the population takes at least one holiday per year, with an average of 3.94 holidays per person. This seems quite a lot to me. It depends on what you call a “holiday”. Is a day trip to Brighton a holiday? Answers on a postcard please?

If you go abroad, Spain is the most popular travel destination with 17.8 million trips made in 2023. Other popular places in Europe are France, Italy, Greece and Portugal; and the USA is number one for longer trips. The most popular holiday destinations in the UK for 2025 include Cornwall, the Lake District, Northumberland, North Wales, and the Scottish Highlands. Brighton and York are also popular choices for shorter breaks. The changing climate is having an effect on where we British take our holidays. People, not surprisingly, are put off bad experiences. The BBC recently ran a story about climate change and the fact that some are avoiding the extreme heat of mainly southern European destinations. The recent extreme weather, especially in Southern Europe with risk of fire, water shortages and travel problems mean that tourists are less likely to go to the hottest countries in the Summer. That means more stay in the UK and add to tourism related issues in this country.

Of course, the opposite is also true. If you experience cold and rainy weather you would not to return to the destination whether you had spent money on going abroad or in this country. Many people feel there is lot to see in this country. Why go abroad, when you can sit on a beach in wind and rain in England? You do not have the money/passports/insurance language problems.

The traditional holiday in this country started with rich people taking water cures at seaside health resorts, popularised by Royalty. Brighton and Scarborough started as health spas. Railways, and then air travel, made holidays possible as did paid Bank Holidays.

I wonder what the future will bring for holidays. More short breaks or just one long holiday a year?

In the bus stop near the village hall there are two cupboards that comprise the Stone Village library

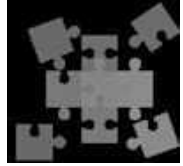
Currently, the cupboards contain a selection books for all ages.

Saint Swithun

The weather is our favourite topic of conversation. Swithun was an Anglo-Saxon bishop of Winchester and later the patron saint of Winchester Cathedral. According to tradition, if it rains on 15 July it will continue for forty days. I did not know the exact text is 'if it rains on Saint Swithun's bridge in Winchester', so it is quite specific.

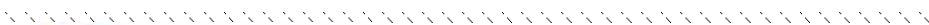
Swithun was adopted as the patron of the restored church at Winchester, formerly dedicated to St. Peter and St. Paul. His body was moved to a new church on 15 July 971 accompanied by numerous miracles before and after. I would think this meant he did not want to be moved, thank you very much.

The traditional rhyme is,

*St. Swithun's day if thou dost rain
For forty days it will remain
St. Swithun's day if thou be fair
For forty days 'twill rain nae mare
A Buckinghamshire variation says:
If on St. Swithun's day it really pours
You're better off to stay indoors*



There is a scientific basis to the weather pattern behind the legend of St. Swithun's day. Around the middle of July, the jet stream settles into a pattern which, in the majority of years, holds reasonably steady until the end of August. When the jet stream lies north of the British Isles then continental high pressure is able to move in; when it lies across or south of the British Isles, Arctic air and Atlantic weather systems predominate.



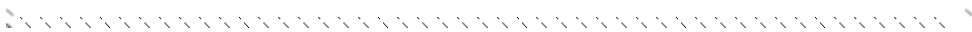



Helping people in our community affected by neurological conditions to live life to the full.

The Chilterns Neuro Centre is a local charity, based in Wendover, that has provided support to people with MS, as well as their family and carers, for almost four decades.

More recently, it opened up its services to people affected by Parkinson's and strokes.

The ethos of the charity is about helping people affected by life-changing neurological conditions to live life to the full.

It achieves this through the wide range of services it offers its 800 members, ranging from physiotherapy and hydrotherapy to acupuncture and pilates.



It also hosts a series of therapeutic leisure groups such as art, singing and social activities

In a recent survey of its members, 99% said they would recommend the Centre to people with a neurological condition.

"The Centre has been like a breath of fresh air to me and the support I've received from everyone has been second to none. The staff, volunteers and other members have all been so warm and supportive and it has made an incredible difference to my recovery."

It costs about £1.2 million every year to run the Centre, £100,000 per month or £5,000 per day.

However, only 6% of that funding comes from the NHS, the rest has to be raised through trusts and foundations, donations, sponsorship or events.
