Editorial -

"O Little Town of Bethlehem"

Oh little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie
Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by
Yet in thy dark streets shineth, the everlasting light
The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.
For Christ is born of Mary, and gathered all above
While mortals sleep the angels keep their watch of wondering love
Oh morning stars together, proclaim thy holy birth.



This Christmas favourite was written in 1868 by an American pastor. It was inspired by visiting the village of Bethlehem in 1865. Rev Brooks didn't think the carol would last long. According to the story, Brooks travelled on horseback between Jerusalem and Bethlehem on Christmas Eve.

"Before dark we rode out of town to the field where they say the shepherds saw the star. It is a fenced piece of ground with a cave in it, in which, strangely enough, they put the shepherds. . . . Somewhere in those fields we rode through, the shepherds must have been. As we passed, the shepherds were still 'keeping watch over their flocks,' or leading them home to fold."

It is very popular on both sides of the Atlantic but usually sung to different tunes. In this country we use the tune written by Ralph Vaughan Williams. The words bring back so many memories and different feelings. It a carol that sums up the Christian message about hope and reassurance. Whatever you are doing have a good break and a Happy Christmas.

And praises sing to God the king, and peace to men on earth. Oh little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by Yet in thy dark streets shineth, the everlasting light The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.

Letter from Aston Sandford

Christmas 2022

I am drafting this piece in glorious Autumn sunshine, when the view from my window is of glowing red, yellow and bronze trees and shrubs. But the shops are already full of Christmas, indeed I have seen more than one Christmas advert on television. No doubt we will soon be told there are only so many shopping days to go. Sadly, given the current, and forecast, economic situation it is going to be a tough Christmas, to say nothing of a tough winter, for so many people.



It will too be a very different Christmas. The first without that Christmas Day afternoon ritual, 'The Queen' as it was always called in our family: The Queen's Christmas Message or the Royal Christmas Message - more formally Her Majesty's Most Gracious Speech. I am old enough to remember the first televised Queen's Christmas Message in 1957; it was a landmark occasion, broadcast live from Sandringham. That Christmas happened to be the 25th anniversary of the first Christmas Radio Broadcast, made by the Queen's grandfather King George V in 1932 (and scripted by Rudyard Kipling). 2022 is the 100th anniversary of the BBC, and apparently the first suggestion for something like a royal Christmas radio message was made 100 years ago but not taken up. I can also remember the Christmas TV broadcast in colour, in 1967, by which time the broadcast was recorded in advance. But this year it will be the King's Christmas Message and I am in no doubt that it will be a moving one - I will be watching with a box of tissues to hand.

For all of us there will be much to remember and much to reflect upon in this extraordinary year. For many households it will be the first Christmas without a treasured member of the family. In our case it will be the first Christmas without my lovely mother-in-law Mary, who died just after Christmas last year, and who had spent so many happy Christmases in Aston Sandford over the years.

Aston Sandford will be holding its usual monthly service of Communion with hymns on Sunday 18th December at 11am, and its Carol Service on Saturday 24th December at 6 30pm. We'd love to see you at either or both of those services!

Dinton and Stone - Christmas Entertainments in 1922

On Christmas Eve Sunday 1922 there was a special service of Christmas music by the Dinton Choral Society at the parish church. The whole village and local non-conformists were invited. The Choral Society had been set up in August and had thirty members. There was a mixed progamme of carols that took the congregation through the Christmas story. The church was packed for one of the biggest congreagtions for a long time. They included *O Come all ye faithful* and other numbers, that were popular at the time such as *Prepare thyself O Zion*, *Whence comes the Light* and *How shall I Fitly Meet Thee?*

At Christmas a concert organised by the Stone Village Hall Committee was held featuring "The Versatiles", which was a concert party comprising local "artistes"; Miss Newstead, Dora Proctor, Messrs W Johnson C Hawkins and A Walker. They raised £8. 5 shillings for local causes.

The day before the 1st Stone Girl Guides held an entertainment at the Village Hall. Lady Stopford, the District Commissioner attended as did the County Commissioner, Lady Smyth. The girls presented a Christmas tableau and carols were sung. The cast included Miss F Plested (Joseph), D May (Mary), Margaret and Marjorie Turnham and E May were Wise Men, H Morgan, M Woodford E Wright were shepherds and J Woodford and E Miles were children.

A well-attended entertainment in aid of Dinton Village Hall was held at the Mental Hospital. It was organised by Dr and Ms Kerr. There was a performance of "A Tight Corner" and a farce called "In the Cellar". Selections were played by the hospital orchestra.

The traditional song 'The Twelve Days of Christmas' is a Christmas-time classic – but it has a deeper meaning, according to some: each of the days representing something about our faith.

The First day: A partridge in a pear tree represents Jesus Christ upon the cross

The Second day: Two turtle doves: refer to the Old and New

The Third day: Three French hens stand for faith, hope and love — the three gifts of the Spirit that abide (1 Corinthians 13)

The Fourth day: The four calling birds refer to the four evangelists who wrote the Gospels – Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, who sing a song of salvation through Jesus Christ.

The Fifth day: The five golden rings represent the first five books of the Bible, also called the Jewish Torah: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy, celebrating all that unites us with our Jewish brothers and sisters.

The Sixth day: The six geese a-laying are the six days of creation.

The Seventh day: The seven swans a-swimming refer to the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and the fear of the Lord (Isaiah 11, 1-3)



The Eighth day: The eight maids a-milking represent the eight Beatitudes listed in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5, 3-11)

The Ninth day: The nine ladies dancing are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Galatians 5, 22,23)

The Tenth day: Ten lords leaping represent the Ten Commandments

The Eleventh day: Eleven pipers piping for the eleven faithful apostles

The Twelfth day: Twelve drummers drumming remind us of the twelve points of belief expressed in the Apostles' Creed

So as we sing joyfully to celebrate Jesus' coming we're reminded of all these wonderful aspects of our faith.






