

News from Aston Sandford

Coronation kneeler



At this year's APCM we agreed to commemorate the Coronation by seeking contributions from our congregation for a tapestry Coronation kneeler kit. We easily raised the money, and our own expert needleperson Alan Paterson very kindly stitched it for us (see above). It was much admired at our August service when it was blessed by the Rev Cassa Messervy. Huge thanks to Alan – it really is beautifully done.

Parish boundary

In my Letter in the July edition of this magazine, under the title of *Living in Aston Sandford*, I described the outlying areas of the parish as extending from the junction of what the Council calls the Risborough Road and the A4129, and thence towards Longwick, ending on the east side of Green Lane, ie not including Penns. I continued 'Curiously the bungalow on the opposite side of the A4129 diagonally opposite Penns <u>is</u> included within the parish.'. Sue Belgrove of Pasture Farm has pointed out that there is nothing curious about the bungalow being included in the parish – because the parish boundary is not the A4129 but the small brook, one field back towards Ilmer, which is a tributary of the river Thame. The A4129 was built after the parish boundary was settled, and she thinks that the original entrance to Pasture Farm itself may have been from Green Lane.

Ride and Stride

Our rider was again Neil McIntyre and, in over 25C heat, he visited 11 churches and rode 18.5 miles. I am delighted to say we collected sponsorship money of £690. Huge congratulations to Neil and thanks to all our sponsors.

Confirmation service

On the afternoon of 8th October Nick and I, Laura Macpherson, the Ven Dr Gordon Kuhrt and Olive Kuhrt attended the Confirmation Service held at Dinton Church to witness Louise Hosking's confirmation. Her husband Tom and children Eleri and Griff were also there. It was a lovely service on another lovely day.

Harvest Festival Weekend

Our Open Day on Saturday 14th October, organised by Sue Peck, was another success: bright sunshine brought over 50 visitors to the church to see our Harvest Decorations. Their kind donations raised (with gift aid) about £120. Harvest Festival the following day, taken by the Rev Mike Bisset, was well attended, and we sang lustily. On the following day Sue and David Peck took 11 bags and boxes of donated goods to Aylesbury Food Bank. Again, thanks to all flower arrangers, helpers and donors.

There will be our usual monthly Communion Service with hymns on Sunday 17th December at 11 00am, when the church will be partly decorated. Brussels Sprouts -Love Them or Loath Them? - Our Cookery Correspondent Writes

Brussels Sprouts are a seasonal favourite and traditional accompaniment to Christmas Dinner. They are not everyone's favourite as I well know.

They were originally a Mediterranean plant but became popular in the Low Countries – hence their name. In Continental Europe, the largest producers are the Netherlands, at 82,000 metric tons, and Germany, at 10,000 tons. The United Kingdom has production comparable to that of the Netherlands, but its crop is not usually exported. Surprisingly second to the Netherlands in exports is Mexico where the sunny climate allows nearly year-round production. I had always thought the flavour was improved after the first frost.

Brussels are good for you as they contain high levels of vitamin C and vitamin K (169% DV), with more moderate amounts of B vitamins, such as vitamin B_6 , as well as folate; essential minerals and dietary fibre.

I have seen lots of different suggestions of what to do with this vegetable including stir fry, raw as a coleslaw, baked in the oven and even spicy Indian versions. My advice is just boil them quickly and DON'T OVERCOOK as that is when the bitter taste comes out. There is no need to cross cut the base. Halve them if they are big. Enjoy with marg or butter or even chestnuts.



A Christmas message from the Rector, the Revd Cassa Messervy <u>Advent: Watching and Waiting in Faith</u>

'How many sleeps now Mummy?' was the urgent question asked by my children when they were younger in the weeks before Christmas, it seemed so long for them even with the daily joy of opening the little windows on their Nativity Advent calendars and consuming the chocolates inside! However for us as adults the mad rush of this season can be in complete juxtaposition with the idea of 'waiting', this season reminds us that we are watching and waiting in faith throughout our lives even in the struggles and difficulties of our lives.

'The Meaning is in the Waiting' is the title of a wonderful Advent book by Paula Gooder, in it she explores the season of Advent's main theme of waiting through the four the candles of the Advent wreath which remind us of: the Patriarchs, the Prophets, John the Baptist and Mary. Paula says



that Advent calls us to a state of active waiting: a state that recognizes and embraces the glimmers of God's presence in the world, that recalls and celebrates God's historic yet ever-present actions in our world, and that speak to us about the challenging almost-but-not-quite nature of our Christian living, which yearns for but cannot quite achieve divine perfection.

Anna the prophetess described by Luke in chapter two of his Gospel is a wonderful example of this waiting in faith, she 'never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day', she had lost her husband young and had no children but even in the difficulties of her life she found meaning and comfort in waiting in faith in the temple in the presence of God for the child who would come and save us all.

Advent reminds us that waiting is not just postponement, not even just preparation, but something that is valuable in its own right. It reminds us that waiting in faith takes time; our whole lives in fact. Waiting time is also redeeming time. Advent summons us to the present moment, to a still yet active, a tranquil yet steadfast commitment to live the life we live now in faith.

'The meaning is in the waiting', may you be blessed in your waiting in faith and a very happy Christmas to you all.

Christmas church services 99 years ago.

The services at Stone in 1924 were "exceptionally well attended". There was a choral service of Holy Communion at 8am on Christmas Day, matins and another service at 11am and then evensong with carols at 6pm. At Hartwell church there was a communion service at 9.45am and evensong at 3pm. There were two services at Bishopstone in the morning on Christmas Day.

Pigs in Blankets

These are small sausages wrapped in bacon. When my vegetarian cousin comes round – well I do veggie sausages wrapped in a slither of aubergine. He likes them.

Bread Sauce - Homemade bread sauce is really nice. Boil an onion dotted with cloves in milk and then add bread and butter.

Gravy – of course. Make it using water you have used to boil the veg.

Roast potatoes - Need to be crispy and well done.

Cranberry sauce - Try to make your own. It tastes much better than shop bought. Just gently boil the fresh berries in a little water and add the rind of oranges and a bit of sugar.

Parsnips - Another traditional treat. Don't take as long as spuds.

Stuffing - I make mine using breadcrumbs, onion and celery. Mix it up and add sage and pop on oven.

Christmas is a time for going the extra mile in the kitchen. These are all the trimmings I can think of. Must dash, the memsahib is calling. She wants a hand with the turkey. A tough old bird, but I like her.

Wildlife Spotlight



Berkshire, Buckinghamshire & Oxfordshire Wildlife Trust (BBOWT)

Founded in 1959, BBOWT aims to create more nature everywhere, for everyone. With 150 staff, we inspire and empower local people to help bring nature back, including our 1,700 volunteers and hundreds more individuals, community groups and partners. By working together, we can create bigger, wilder, more connected landscapes so nature and people can thrive.

With more than 80 nature reserves across our three counties covering almost 2,700 hectares, we now manage more land for wildlife than ever before. In Buckinghamshire our flagship site is College Lake, a huge reserve with a thriving wildlife lake, visitor centre, café and shop. We also work with communities in cities, towns and villages as well as farmers and landowners.

Climate Crisis

We are currently facing a nature and climate crisis. Because of intensive agricultural practices such as widespread pesticide use and fertiliser run-off, inappropriate development and pollution, the UK is one of the most nature-depleted countries in the world compared to the pre-industrial era. Now, we face the additional threat of climate change which is already impacting wildlife such as dormice, birds, insects and beech trees right here on our doorstep.

Water Voles

Our Water Vole Recovery Project has helped increase the range of this threatened species in our area by nearly 80%; our Badger Vaccination Project has inoculated hundreds of badgers against bovine TB, and our Save Our Chalk Streams campaign recently saw us join a Parliamentary summit to discuss new legislation to protect these precious waterways. Our Reconnecting Bernwood, Otmoor and The Ray project is working with farmers and landowners in Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire to explore ways to make the entire landscape more wildlife-friendly, and we are continuing to push HS2 Ltd to halt the unnecessary destruction of nature on our patch.

How to get involved with BBOWT

With so many threats to wildlife still increasing, last month we launched our biggest-ever appeal, the Nature Recovery Fund. To tackle the nature and climate crisis in our area, we are aiming to raise £3 million in the next three years to help bring wildlife back and benefit climate and people. The fund will target three critical areas of **BBOWT's** work — nature, climate and people. The fund will help protect more land to bring nature back, restore more woodland and floodplain to

guard against climate change, and inspire communities and young people to care for wildlife. At Christmas be Merry, and Thank God [Most] of All:

This is an occasional series featuring Thomas Tusser (c. 1524 – 3 May 1580) who was a poet and farmer, best known for his instructional poem Five Hundred Points of Good Husbandry, first published in 1557. It was among the bestselling poetry books of the Elizabethan age. It was he that came up with the saying, "Christmas comes but once a year"

Christmas.

- 42 Get ivy and holly, woman deck up thy house: and take this same brawne, for to seeth and to souse.[?] Provide as good cheer, for thou knowst the old guise: old customs, that good be, let no man despise.
- 43 At Christmas be merry, and thank God of all: and feast thy poor neighbours, the great with the small. yea all the year long, have an eye to the poor: and God shall send luck, to keep open thy door.
- 44 Good fruit and good plenty, doth well in thy loft: then lay for an orchard, and cherish it oft.

 The profit is mickell [great], the pleasure is much: at pleasure with profit, few wise men will grutch.
- 45 For plants and for stocks, lay afore hand to cast: but set or remove them, while twelve tide doe last. Set one from another, full twenty foot square: the better and greater, they yearly will bear.


