

News from Aston Sandford

Kneeling in Aston Sandford

In my newsletter in December's magazine, I included an item on our latest kneeler, commemorating the Coronation of King Charles III, beautifully worked by Alan Paterson. It has joined other kneelers stitched by members of the congregation to commemorate Royal events over the last 50 or so years.

Most of our Royal kneelers are in the Chancel. In the nave is a collection of some 50 tapestry kneelers, mostly patterns purchased from Jacksons of Hebden Bridge, donated and worked by members of the congregation mostly in the 1980s. The previous kneelers would have been familiar to any churchgoer of A Certain Age: they were probably covered with a hard-wearing material called Rexine, an artificial leather invented in 1915. Despite a tendency to be flammable, Rexine was widely used for upholstery – it was used for instance in cars, in bookbinding and apparently on the paws of teddy bears.

26 of our kneelers were worked by Mrs W M Tuckett (mother-in-law of Betty Tuckett) over a two-year period prior to her death in 1983. Mrs Tuckett was a VAD nurse in the First World War and was mentioned in despatches for saving the lives of soldiers after her troop ship was torpedoed off the coat of Portugal; she also received a Gallipoli Campaign Medal.

In the early 1980s Betty Tuckett herself undertook the work on the most ambitious piece of tapestry in the church, the Communion kneelers, edged in royal blue, which were designed especially for the church. The festivals of Christmas and Harvest are depicted in two side kneelers, while the main, 5 foot wide, kneeler shows pictorially from left to right Stone Lacey, The Manor, the Church, the Old Rectory and Sandford Cottage, where Betty and Tuck lived for so many years. It took two years to complete. It is an exquisite piece and quite rightly won commendation in a national church needlework exhibition some years ago.



Betty later made a lovely tapestry cover for the Rector's kneeler, in complementary colours and featuring the dedication of the church and local flowers.



We have other beautiful pieces of needlework designed and worked by Alan Paterson - a full pew width seat cushion in pale blue and lemon yellow and two blue leather collection bags decorated in fine needlepoint. We also have a collection of single cross stitch seat cushions worked by members of the congregation.

A 'kneeler' is a comparatively new concept – its forerunner was known as a 'hassock'. Hassocks were indeed originally made from hassocks or tufts of grass or peat or turf; later they were stuffed with straw which no doubt appealed greatly to mice and other creatures.

In introducing stitched kneelers Aston Sandford Church was following a trend which had apparently started in the 1930s. According to Elizabeth Bingham in her book Kneelers: the unsung folk art of England and Wales, published in 2023 by Chatto and Windus (it has pictures of wonderful, mostly modern design needlework kneelers), the history of decorated church kneelers, and indeed seat cushions, goes back to the early 17th century. The earliest Elizabeth Bingham cites are two Turkey work kneelers made for Wadham College, Oxford; Turkey work, or Turkeywork, was an English knotted-and-cut pile furnishing textile produced from the sixteenth to the mid-eighteenth centuries, used for cushions etc and particularly for chair seats and backs. She has examples too of fine Berlin work, popular in Europe in the mid nineteenth century and similar to today's tapestry work. But the trend towards worked decorative kneelers apparently began in the 1930s with a much-publicised project at Winchester Cathedral of beautifully worked seat cushions designed as a piece by local artist Sybil Blunt (1880-1952; she later designed a tapestry for the Women's Institute to commemorate the work of women during the Second World War which is now in the Imperial War Museum in London). Other Cathedrals followed Winchester's lead, but the war intervened, and it was not until the 1953 Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II that enthusiasm for stitched kneelers really took off. The results, as shown in the rest of the book, can be individual and great fun.

It must be said that Elizabeth Bingham would not really approve of our uncoordinated collection of patterns and colours – but she would I am sure very much approve of Betty's kneelers which have immediate relevance to the parish, and of Alan's individual pieces in similar colours.



Every Year

Every year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the Festival of the Passover. When he was twelve years old, they went up to the festival, according to the custom. After the festival was over, while his parents were returning home, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but they were unaware of it. Thinking he was in their company, they travelled on for a day. Then they began looking for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they went back to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. Everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished. His mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you."

"Why were you searching for me?" he asked. "Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he was saying to them.

Luke 2 41 -50

The bible does not tell us much about Jesus' childhood however this event stood out in Mary's memory. The family went every year to a major festival in Jerusalem and He got lost. His parents must have been beside themselves. They eventually found him in the courtyards, chatting to the religious leaders. Like all children He was full of questions. "Why?" must have come up several times.

This passage points us to both the human side of a loving family and His special role as His father's son.

Wildlife Spotlight - Chiltern Society Community WildBelt Project

For almost 60 years, the Chiltern Society has been there to help people improve their part of the Chilterns. With our volunteers, members, and partners, we are tackling some of the most serious threats to the countryside – from climate change, to overbearing development and disappearing green spaces and wildlife – to care for our unique landscape.



The people of the Chilterns are at the heart of our work. Through partnerships with national and local stakeholders, we enable individuals and communities to make a difference on their own doorsteps, and through this, take positive action for the environment.

The Community WildBelt project, funded by The National Lottery Heritage Fund and the Rothschild Foundation is a pilot project which aims to develop a sustainable approach to delivering joined-up nature conservation at a local level through volunteering. The foundation of the project will be supporting and linking up volunteers and their projects to improve Nature Recovery in their local area.

The WildBelt project is focussed around the Wendover area and surrounding parishes.

Biodiversity is in steep decline across our countryside. Not only is this a loss of our natural heritage but to the ecosystems which are our strongest natural defence against climate change.

A step change is needed to ensure large scale recovery to nature. We believe that involving a far greater range of people from the local community is the only way to achieve this transformation and bridge the gap between national and regional strategies, and local delivery. And the time to do it is now.

People want to contribute but often don't know where to start. We will help people develop the skills and confidence to take on the ownership of their own nature projects, and help them become rooted in their community for years to come.

We have projects in Aston Clinton, Wendover, Weston Turville and Stoke Mandeville which include everything from wildflower meadow creation, hedge planting, orchard planting, pond management and hedgerow management.





We are looking to recruit local volunteers. No experience necessary, and tools and training will be provided. You'll be working with different parish councils, community groups and private landowners. You may be involved in planting a new orchard, improving the biodiversity of chalk streams, tree planting, creating a wildflower meadow or recording wildlife.

Both volunteering and being in nature benefits mental health and wellbeing. Volunteering for the Community WildBelt increases physical activity and opportunities



to socialise with likeminded people and in doing so reduces isolation, stress and anxiety, and help gain new skills.

Nature projects provide great opportunities for people to take positive action to improve their local environment increasing a sense of pride. Our volunteers see how their work is tackling climate change and the depletion in nature.




