





News from Aston Sandford

The residents of Aston Sandford are always proud to say that they live in one of the smallest villages in England. Outsiders think Aston Sandford is a hamlet. Indeed, if you look at the definitions on the internet you may be forgiven for thinking that - the definitions appear to emphasise size of population, so that a village has a larger population than a hamlet but smaller than a town.

Nevertheless, most mention that a hamlet lacks a focal point such as a church or other meeting point. The definitive Oxford English Dictionary says specifically that in Britain a hamlet lacks a church. So we are indeed a village, even if in all other respects we appear to be a hamlet!

The village itself is located around the Church, and consists of The Manor, the Old Rectory and nine other houses, five of which are modern – plus a number of business units at Manor Farm. The village was originally much bigger, built around a huge village green – it is known as a ‘shrunken village’ though why it shrank to the area around the Church and Manor Farm is open to speculation. The wider parish includes Pasture Farm and the Black and Brown Barn businesses, and extends to the junction of the what the Council calls the Risborough Road and the A4129, and from there towards Longwick, ending on the east side of Green Lane (so not including Penns). Curiously the bungalow on the opposite side of the A4129 diagonally opposite Penns is included within the parish. Altogether, and including the Pasture Farm, there are 12 more residences in this outlying area of the parish. Most of the houses were built in the 20th century or within the last 20 years.



As of May 2023, the population of the village is 29, and in the outlying area, at least 30 – so in total something over 60. In Bettie Macpherson’s book *Aston Sandford Only*, published in 1994, the late Tuck Tuckett noted that ‘*over the last few generations the [population] figure has varied from between 80 and 30*’ – a rough estimate which is borne out in what few records we have. Bettie herself recorded elsewhere in the book that the population of the Parish was currently 42, of whom 28 lived in the village.

A few years earlier, in the 1986 *Chronicle of the Vale* (with which Bettie was involved), the population in Aston Sandford village was recorded as 29 (it seems that the *Chronicle* ignored dwellings in the wider parish other than Pasture and Black Barn Farms, or maybe included them under Longwick or Imler), and was

thus the least populated village in the Vale (closely followed by Horsenden at 32 and Owlswick at 36).

The earliest population figure we have is that of 1801, the year of the first census in the UK, when it was 71. This figure was recorded in Lipscomb's *History of the Antiquities of the County of Buckingham Volume I* (published in 1830), which also records that the 1811 figure was 70. Lipscomb goes on to say that '*in 1821 [the year of the second census] there were fourteen families, all, excepting that of the Rector, employed in agriculture*'. It should be borne in mind that at the time at least two of the older houses in the village, including our own, were divided into two, and that there may not have been any outlying houses in the village other than Pasture and Black Barn Farms.

The early censuses were solely headcounts and any data collected was mostly destroyed. The first census to collect personal information was that of 1841, regarded as the first modern census, the first time that the head of each household was given a form to fill in on behalf of everyone in the dwelling on a set day. Unfortunately, it is difficult to extrapolate information from the early censuses available on line because few of the houses in Aston Sandford are identified – usually just the Manor and the Rectory. Other dwellings are simply numbered 1 – 12 without any indication of where those dwellings were. Analysis is further complicated by the fact that in some censuses (eg 1911) Aston Sandford is included with Stone and Dinton with little indication of who lived where!

What I think I have established is that in 1841 it appears that there were 76 living in the village. The next census, in 1851, however specifically named Pasture Farm and what was called 'Brown Barn Farm' and states that all the other 12 households were on 'Aston Green', that is to say in the village itself; the total population was 88. By 1871 the figure appears to be 54, in 12 houses, including the Manor and the Rectory, but it is hard to work out which houses were included. While it is clear that most of the males were still employed in agriculture, there were six lacemakers among the women. By 1901 (the last census I have been able to look at) 10 households are listed, plus Pasture Farm, and in total the population was 46. Most of the men were engaged in agriculture, including one blacksmith (and no lacemakers are listed amongst the women).

However unclear the records are, it seems that Tuck's estimate of a population over the generations of 30 – 80 was about right, and that the population decline probably started in the late 19th century, but has remained remarkably stable in the last 40 years.

July was harvest time

- 90 Then muster thy folk, play the captain thy self:
providing them weapon, and such kind of pelfe(?).
Get bottles and bags, keep the field in the heat:
the feare is not much, but the danger is great.
- 91 With tossing and raking, and setting on cox:
the grass that was green, is now hay for an ox.
That done, leave the tieth, lode thy cart and away:
the battle is fought, thou hast gotten the day.
- 93 Thy fallow betimes, for destroying of weed:
least thistle and dock, fall a blooming and seed.
Such season may hap, it shall stand the upon:
to till it again, or the summer be gone.
- 96 Saint limes (James) willeth husbands, get reapers at hand:
the corn being ripe, doe but shed as it stand.
Be saving and thankful, for that god hath sent:
he sendeth it thee, for the self-same intent.
- 97 Reap well scatter not, gather cleane (glean) that is shorn:
bind fast, shock apace, pay the tenth of thy corn.
Lode safe, carry home, lose no time, being fair:
goife just, in the barn, it is out of dispaire.
- 98 This done, set the poor over all for to glean:
and after thy cattle, to eat it up clean.
Then spare it for pasture, till rowen be past:
to lengthen thy day, no better thou hast.
- 99 Then welcome thy harvest folk, servants and all:
with mirth and good cheer, let them furnish th[i]ne hall
The harvest lord nightly, must give the a song:
fill him then the blackeboll, or else he hath wrong.
- 100 Thy harvest thus ended, in mirth and imoye:
please everyone gently, man woman and boy.
Thus doing, with alway, such help as they can:
thou winnest the name, of a right husband man.





UPTON CORONATION CELEBRATIONS



Upton Coronation Celebrations took place with a “bring and share” supper on Saturday May 6th. The supper was held at Amanda and Graeme Bassett’s home, Lower Farmhouse in Upton. Despite the very wet weather that afternoon, the rain stopped just in time and around 56 people attended. A good time was had by all, with thanks to the organisers and everyone who attended and brought along their delicious food. Unused cakes were donated to The Seven Stars for

their event on Sunday May 7th, and all unopened food was donated to Aylesbury Food Bank.

DINTON CORONATION CELEBRATIONS

The bells were rung by Andrew Wild at the Church of St. Peter & St. Paul, Dinton on May 6, to mark the Coronation of King Charles III.

A Coronation Treasure Hunt on Sunday, May 7 was organised around Dinton followed by a barbecue in the garden at The Seven Stars in Dinton. Thank you to the Community Events Team for organising the event and for Steph and her team for providing an excellent barbecue.

Marion Baker raised £175 for the Aylesbury Foodbank by making cakes for people to buy to celebrate the Coronation.

Interesting people from Stone no 7: Elizabeth and Arthur Croxton Waine, tenants of Lower Hartwell Farm 1884 to 1923, and their diarist daughter Mabel:



On Dec 3, 1873, Elizabeth Gibbons wore this blue silk dress to marry farmer Arthur Croxton Waine at Ambrosden. In 1894 they took over the tenancy of the C16/17 timber framed brick built Lower Hartwell Farm, part of the Lee estate, and moved in from Marsh Gibbon with children Rachel, Arthur, Aubrey and Alex. The annual rent was £220.



Their last and best loved, but fragile, child Mabel, below, right, was born in 1896 and christened at Hartwell Church. Mabel later kept a diary for several years, recording the many events on the farm, the doings of her brothers and sister and her own enjoyment in village events, regularly cycling up the dark lane to attend the working parties of the Young Helpers League in the Reading Room near the Church, warmed by a smoky oil stove, making gifts to sell at Lady Smyth's summer Fetes in the gardens at St John's Lodge. Mabel reported in her diary local fetes and celebrations and the annual pantomimes, entertainments and lantern lectures at the new Village Hall, and there were trips to Aylesbury to the theatre and to celebrate Empire Day, and further afield to see relatives. She worked hard on the farm, dealing with hens, rabbits, piglets, calves and sheep,



(see left, below, sister Rachel, 30, in 1808 with their sheep), helping with haymaking and harvesting. Mabel sold her rabbits for a shilling each and in autumn collected and sold blackberries. On November 5, 1912, she enjoyed a bonfire at Coldharbour Farm, where they burned an effigy of Lloyd George!

In December 1912 she records her first telephone conversation and in February 1913 her first sights of an aeroplane and a balloon. The last entry was in December 9, 1914: *"I went up to Stone on my bicycle and Ken Woodford run into me on his motor bike. It didn't hurt me or him but smashed up my bike.... Aubrey came home from the War last week he has been fighting the Germans...the war is terrible."*

Mabel died at 19, probably from a recurrence of TB, on June 28, 1916. The detailed newspaper report of her funeral at Hartwell Church lists the many people at the service and the senders of wreaths. Four choirboys sang a hymn by her grave. She is buried with most of her family members, just inside the graveyard wall at Hartwell.

Six months before, after a very similar service, the Bucks Herald had reported the funeral of Mabel's friend Theodora Carter, also 19, of Coldharbour, buried at Hartwell with her tiny brother, Cecil, who died in 1899 at 8 months. The Waines finally left the farm in 1923. In 1939 the tenancy moved to the Woodford family, and it and Whaddon Hill are now tenanted by Mike Woodford, together with Calley Farm, Sedrup, and Bishopstone Farm. Mike is now the only remaining Ernest Cooke farm tenant on the Hartwell Estate.

With thanks to the late Eileen Smith, Rachel's daughter in law, and her family for the diary, and to Mike's mother, Jenny Woodford, who still lives at Lower Hartwell Farm.


