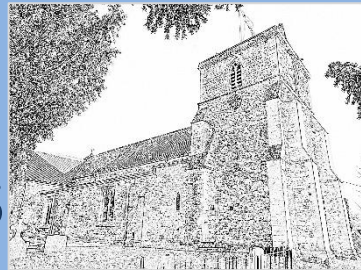

News from Aston Sandford

Residents of Aston Sandford were saddened to learn of the death on 22nd February of Chris Hawkins who, with his wife Maggie, had lived in the village for four years. Chris was of course well known as the owner and founder of Haddenham Garden Centre, so close to the village, and having lived in Aston Sandford throughout the pandemic it felt as if he and Maggie were long term residents.

Chris was born on 31st December 1945 in Edgware, north London, and was raised in Pinner, in the same London Borough of Harrow. His father Jack Hawkins was a manager at the Rolls Royce Works at Leavesden, near Abbots Langley (now the site of the attraction Warner Bros Studios). When Chris left school he did a five year engineering apprenticeship, but working indoors for five years lead him to decide to have a complete change of career. And so he became a self-employed landscape gardener for 10 years. In 1970 he and Margaret got married, and they went on to have three children, Stephen, Kate and Ben. In 1978 he opened the nurseries which were to become Haddenham Garden Centre, and his father Jack took early retirement to help him. Maggie looked after the nursery side, growing all the plants, and in time the children joined the business too. As we all know the Garden Centre has developed over the years, and especially since 2018 when the final development took place with its splendid Gardener's Retreat Restaurant. Chris was always so proud of the business and his family, and still



kept a close eye on Stephen, Kate, and Ben who now run it to make sure they were on the right track!

Less well known is Chris's other passion - first motorbikes and latterly encouraging the boys, Ben and Stephen, with their quad bike racing.

Sadly Chris had serious health problems in the last few years, with which he coped uncomplainingly. He was about to return home from Wycombe Hospital after a lengthy recovery from a stroke, when he unexpectedly suffered a further stroke from which he did not recover. He was much loved by his family and all his friends and will be great missed.

The well attended funeral was held on Saturday 18th March at the Chilterns Crematorium at Amersham, and was followed by refreshments at, of course, The Gardener's Retreat. Donations in memory of Chris can be sent to the Oxford Kidney Unit Trust Fund Limited via:

This is an occasional series featuring Thomas Tusser (c. 1524 – 3 May 1580) who was a poet and farmer, best known for his instructional poem *Five Hundred Points of Good Husbandry*, first published in 1557. It was among the bestselling poetry books of the Elizabethan age.

In these verses selected from his passage on the month of June he advises the reader to get weeding.

June

*In June get thy weedhook, thy knife and thy glove:
and weed out such weed, as the corn doth not love.
Slack [waste] no time, thy weeding, for dearth nor for cheap:
thy corn shall reward it, or ever thou reap.*

*The may weed doth burn, and the thistle doth freate:
the Tine pulleth down, both the rye and the wheat.
The dock and the brake, knoweth corn very much:
but bodle for barley, no weed there is such.*

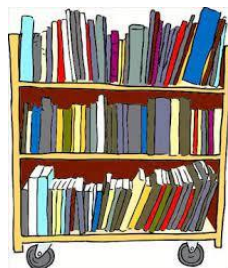

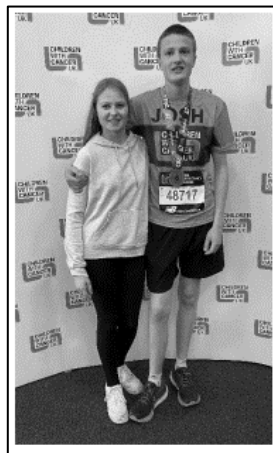

Butterflies

The photo on this month's front cover shows a male Brimstone Butterfly, photographed by Michael Pitt-Payne in his garden. Michael regularly provides details to us on the fauna and flora in the churchyard of St John the Baptist Church, Stone. For this year, Michael reports:

"You will be interested to know that I recorded 18 different species of butterfly in St John's Churchyard last year and once again this was the highest number of species recorded in any churchyard in the Upper Thames region of Butterfly Conservation.

"This is an extract from their magazine Hairstreak:-

"I must, of course, mention our stand-out churchyard at St. John's, Stone, near Aylesbury, which has been managed to benefit butterflies for some years – and always excels. In 2022, a total of 90 butterflies across over 18 species were recorded in St. John's churchyard: a testament to what can be achieved with the right habitat management in place.

"The start this year is proving to be slow but I did see a Brimstone in the Churchyard on the 25th March."

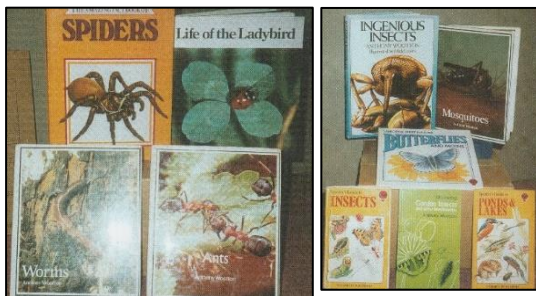
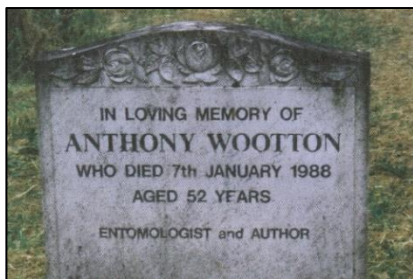
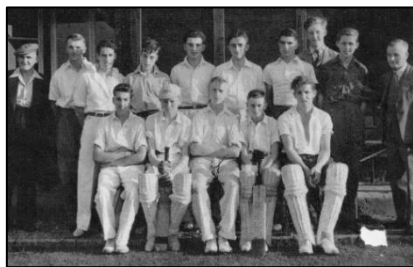
Interesting people from Stone no 6: entomologist and author Anthony Wootton, 1936-88.



Some local people will still remember Tony Wootton, one of Stone's most interesting C20 residents: Born in one of the cottages opposite the Waggon and Horses in Stone in 1936, entomologist Tony Wootton became a widely read and admired naturalist, author and consultant editor, and adviser and presenter to the BBC.

At Stone School and later Aylesbury Grammar School his main interests were in entomology and wildlife, observing, researching and collecting. Sue Spinks remembers him as a neighbour in the 40s, then both families moved c1950 to adjoining council houses on Bishopstone Road. Later, Tony lived in Roundhill, filling his flat with books, slides and drawings. He wrote at least 19 books, mostly for children, using his own photographs and illustrations, and was consultant editorial entomological adviser for many others. A frequent lecturer and an examiner for the Scout movement in natural history, he wrote articles for many magazines and newspapers, including BBC Wildlife Magazine and a weekly "Out of Doors" column in the Bucks Herald.

These photographs show Anthony in the 1957 Stone Colts cricket team. Below, some of his many educational books – and his gravestone in the village cemetery in Eythrope Road.. He died suddenly in January 1988, as he planned a book about Stone Village from his observations of the hedgerows. He had been researching it for 40 years.

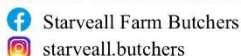

Become A Parish Councillor

What does a Parish Councillor do and what skills are required?

This is a question often asked. The Parish Council consists of people from many walks of life so they have wide ranging views and therefore bring their life experiences to benefit and represent the people who live in the villages of Stone, Bishopstone & Hartwell.

Firstly, and most importantly you would attend the Parish Council Meetings which are held once a month in either the Jubilee Pavilion in Stone or the Bishopstone Village Hall. At these meetings we discuss many matters but the primary responsibilities of the council are:

- Looking after the environment of the parish, i.e. play areas, cemetery etc.
- Ensuring that matters involving pavements and roads are brought to the attention of Buckinghamshire Council so these can be dealt with.
- We administer an annual budget of some £120,000 and plan up to three years in advance.
- Make comments on planning applications.
- Listening to parishioners and aspire to bring a practical resolution to issues.
- Manage contractors working in the parish on behalf of the Parish Council.

All in all, being a Parish Councillor takes around four hours a month, not too much time!

Anyone over the age of 18 who is a British subject may become a Parish Councillor providing that they are a registered elector of the parish or live in or within three miles of the parish.

What do you get back?

Well, you have real say in what is going on in your village and you can make a difference. Meet other village folk. Be part of a team. Put something back into your neighbourhood. Have a better understanding of how a Parish Council works. Help plan the village for the future and for our children.

Your village needs you!
