

#### **Editorial - "The Church Never Looked More Lovely"**

In 1876 harvest festival was celebrated at Dinton Church. There were three services 11 am 3 pm and a special service at 6 pm. All were well attended. The church was beautifully decorated "as usual". Had a number of clergy taking service, reading lesson and preaching. The music for the service was composed by the vicar's brother, a clergyman from Manchester.

140 people sat down to harvest tea on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> September 1895 then was a church service. Led by vicar of Dinton, the rector of Halton read lessons and the sermon preached by Vicar of Hughenden. £4 15 shillings and 6d raised for Bucks Infirmary. The church was brilliantly lit and decorated as it always is.

The Rev. Charles Henry Burton was the vicar of Dinton from 1869 to 1879 and the 1871 Census records that he lived in the Vicarage with his wife, Lydia and their four children, Emiline, Ernest, Hilda and Basil. They had a cook, a parlour maid, a housemaid and an under housemaid. He had moved to Buckinghamshire from Liverpool where he had a parish for over twenty years. There are stained glass windows in the church dedicated to Emiline who died in 1871 and his wife who died in 1877.

I wonder if they sang "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come" written in 1844 while he was rector of Aston Sandford. In 1861 there had been a number of unofficial revisions of the hymn, including one in Hymns Ancient and Modern, which led to Alford publishing a footnote in Poetical Works stating his disapproval of these revisions that had been made without his agreement.

The first verse is written as a celebration of the harvest, calling for people to give thanks to God for it.

Come, ye thankful people, come, Raise the song of harvest home! All is safely gathered in, Ere the winter storms begin; God, our Maker, doth provide For our wants to be supplied; Come to God's own temple, come; Raise the song of harvest home!



#### Harvest Festival Service

Our Harvest Festival service will be on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> October at 11 00am and will be a Communion Service with Hymns. We will of course be singing what is known as the Aston Sandford Hymn, *Come, ye thankful people, come, Raise the song of harvest home!* thought to have been written in about 1844 by the Rev Henry Alford, Rector of Aston Sandford 1836-48, but more likely to have been written by his elder son of the same name, writer of other hymns such as *Ten thousand times ten thousand*, and later to become Dean of Canterbury. We like to think it was at the very least inspired by Aston Sandford. After the service there will be refreshments at the Manor.

We invite donations of food (no fresh produce please) and other suitable items which will be taken to the Aylesbury Food Bank.

Church Open to view Harvest Festival Decorations Saturday, 14<sup>th</sup> October 2023 2.00pm to 4.30 pm

Aston Sandford has its Harvest Festival on Sunday, 15<sup>th</sup> October at 11 am. The Church will, as always, be extensively decorated by the flower arrangers. This year, to give more people a chance to see the decorated church, it will be open from 2 to 4.30 pm, on the previous day.

## Interesting people who have lived in Stone, no10: Slaveowner and anti-abolitionist, MP Sir William Young, Tenant of Hartwell 1801-1807

Anti-abolitionist Sir William, with his family, was the Revd Sir George's tenant at Hartwell from 1801-1807. He was a colonial governor, author, artist and a member of the British parliament. Sir William's family had been super rich sugar plantation owners and he was an ardent anti-abolitionist.

In 1788 his father died and he inherited four sugar plantations, in Antigua, St Vincent (2), and Tobago – together with the hundreds of slaves and a serious debt. (over £11m). He went on an extended trip to the Caribbean, but failed to save his plantations from bankruptcy. On returning home in 1792 he intensified his support of the anti-abolitionists.



In 1801 he leased Hartwell House and brought his second wife and his children there. He clearly enjoyed a country life, hobnobbing with his landlord, the Reverend Sir George Lee and other local gentry, drilling in the Yeomanry, enjoying sport and listening to tenant's problems and complaints – and presumably spending a good deal of time in London in parliament. He wrote an epic poem eulogizing Hartwell and Sir George, who frequently left his Chilterns parish to deal with estate matters at Hartwell and potter round with his tenant.

"If ought could the comforts of home e're restore HARTWELL's'Manor and Farm, with the care of the Poor Open'd grateful delights to my view...
"But what most engag'd me, the Tenant to be was the "landlord" the good and belov'd Sir George Lee Descendant of Hampden, a younger son born His heirdom to Hartwell seem'd bleak and forlorn... but parishioners Cur'ed taught and Fed"...

From 1784 to 1806 Young was MP for St Mawes, where from 1790 his friend the 1st Marquis of Buckingham was patron. From 1806-7 Young was MP for Buckingham. He was very active in Parliament, speaking on poor law reform, income tax, the slave trade, Ireland, foreign policy and parliamentary reform.

He was one of the 81 vice presidents of the Society for Bettering the Conditions of the Poor and was Secretary to the "Association for promoting the Discovery of the Interior Parts of Africa" He wrote or contributed to a huge number of publications. He was a captain in the Bucks Yeomanry and later a major in the Mid Bucks.

His opposition to abolition remained strong – he was the leading opponent of Wilberforce's anti-slavery campaign. – he accused Wilberforce of having no experience. In 1806 Buckingham and his faction manoeuvred a governorship of Tobago for Young. With the changing fortunes of the Grenvilles he was no longer acceptable - and bigger plans were in hand for Hartwell. Young was given just a month to prepare to leave Hartwell and set sail from London on the *Thames*, captained by his "near relation" Brydges Taylor on March 10 1807.


Captain-General and Governor of Tobago until his death there in 1815 Sir William kept diaries which were "a historical, statistical and descriptive account of the island

of Tobago" with watercolour sketches and maps, now together with memoranda, accounts, invoices, etc, in the Library of the University of the West Indies (there are copies in the British Library).

#### Wildlife Spotlight

#### **Tiggywinkles Wildlife Hospital Foundation**

In this month's Wildlife Spotlight we have spoken to Tiggywinkles who are a big part of the local wildlife community in Buckinghamshire. Here is what they had to say:

Tiggywinkles Wildlife Hospital is a specialist hospital dedicated to rescuing and rehabilitating all species of British wildlife. All British wild animal casualties brought to the hospital are treated completely free of charge and are released through a controlled programme, back to the wild, when they are fully fit. Any animal unable to be released back to the wild is maintained at the Hospital, in as natural conditions as possible.



Tiggywinkles are based in Haddenham (HP17 8AF) and a map showing the exact area we cover can be

#### What challenges are you currently facing?

We don't receive government or lottery funding, so we rely heavily on legacies and donations from the public and a handful of Trusts. We also rely on the generosity of a team of volunteers to help us rescue the animals in need.

#### What projects are you currently working on?

We are currently expanding the hospital to accommodate a CPD college for visiting Vets and Nurses enabling us to assist vets across the country, in their quest for wildlife treatments, techniques and medicines.

#### How can local people get involved or help your organisation?

We have various volunteering opportunities that can all be seen at our website here: <a href="https://www.sttiggywinkles.org.uk/volunteer/">https://www.sttiggywinkles.org.uk/volunteer/</a> these include ambulance drivers, rescuers, and husbandry duties.

#### What is the best thing about your role / organisation?

We are one of the leading wildlife hospitals in the world, caring for over 13,000 animals every year and passing on skills and knowledge to the next generation of vets and nurses.

Attached is a photo of a recent Hedgehog Patient we have in that is on her last few days of treatment for lungworm. Lungworm occurs when there is an infestation of the lungs with parasitic worms. She was very poorly with it so we immediately put her on a course of treatment for it and she is so far making a fantastic recovery! Her breathing is a lot better, and we are really looking forward to getting her back out into the wild where she belongs.

The good congregation's prayers were answered, setting up the day for a record attendance at the eight Annual Beer Festival, once again held in the lovely gardens of the Seven Stars pub in Dinton on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> August and visited by a host of walkers from Haddenham, all corners of our Parish and others from further away.

Throughout the afternoon, the cheerful family-based crowd enjoyed the fine weather and the live music by two acts, while enjoying the selection of real ales, ciders and the Pimm's tent, which was run as usual by the Dinton Book Club ladies. Steph laid on a barbecue selling her delicious premium hamburgers and sausages and the Seven Stars kitchen provided a special Beer Festival menu for the day. Dinton Wines had their usual stall selling award winning locally produced Dinton Folly English quality sparkling wine. The event provided great fun and enjoyment for all who attended.

On the day the beer and Pimm's tent took in just over £5000, a healthy increase on last year. Whilst we haven't got the final figures yet, we know that we will have in the region of £5000 to distribute to local projects. When added to the donations already made by the Dinton Beer Festival, this means we will have given out nearly £18,000 since we started the Festival in 2015

A huge and heartfelt thank you goes to all the volunteers from the villages in the Parish and those from farther away, who helped with setting up the event, manning the bars on the day and dismantling everything and clearing away afterwards. As usual, Steph and her staff were on hand to help and again put in every effort to make the day a success.

The generosity of the sponsors who sponsored the real ales, the Pimm's and ciders, the music and the Festival glasses, enable this event to take place. So, a sincere thank you to all the sponsors who make the event possible. As we have said before it is this generosity of spirit, as evidenced by the sponsors and volunteers working together, which makes the Dinton Beer Festival such a successful and enjoyable community and family occasion.

#### Common excuses for not joining the Parish Council

- "I'm too young". If you are 18 you are old enough.
- "What's the point of just joining a talking shop, they don't do anything". Have you ever been to a meeting? Basing your judgement on watching The Vicar of Dibley is definitely not valid.
- "I haven't got a planning application in at the moment". Putting in for planning has got nothing to do with sitting on the Council, whatever may have happened years ago. In fact, if your own application is discussed by the Council, you must leave the room.
- "I'm too busy, I couldn't commit to attending every single meeting". Meetings are rarely more frequent than one evening a month, and missing the occasional one is perfectly acceptable. Most meetings only take a couple of hours.
- "I'm concentrating on finding a job or furthering my career". Being a local Councillor is a definite plus point to add to a CV. It shows you can make decisions, work in a team, are community minded and pro-active. Prospective employees will be impressed.
- "I haven't lived here very long and I don't know the area well". If you have lived or worked in the Parish for a year you are eligible. Your views as an 'incomer' should be welcomed, as you will probably see things more objectively.
- "Our Parish Council is full of Old Fogeys". Join up and change it then.
- "I'd look like a fool because I would not know what's going on". You will be eased in gently; there is help, advice and more formal training available. The Clerk is the legal officer in the Council, and he or she will explain the rules.

Hee Gon shares the following details of his family and faith journey [so far!] "I have pastoral responsibilities for the Methodist Churches in Chinnor, Cuddington, Haddenham, Princes Risborough, Stone and Christchurch, Thame.

My journey to this pastoral role is a unique one, shaped by my early life as a Buddhist in Busan, South Korea before I converted to Christianity at the age of 16. After completing Bible College and my national service, I served as a missionary in the Middle East and was ordained in the Korean Presbyterian Church.

My ministry with the Methodist Church has taken me to various places, including Exeter, Bedlington, Manchester and Llanelli in Wales. Due to health reasons I spent the last two years in the High Wycombe Circuit as a supernumerary Minister [that is, one without a specific pastoral charge]

I firmly believe that being a Christian means that God can transform even the mess of our past into a powerful message: He can take our trials and tests and turn them into testimonies. Consequently, my primary focus in ministry is to support individuals in their Christian journey within the Church and community, building upon the foundations that are already in place.

I am committed to nurturing a deeper experience of God's boundless grace in Christ, and ensuring that everyone feels genuinely welcomed in our church.

My wife Deborah previously worked as a teacher for individuals with learning disabilities in Korea, but has since transitioned into the field of social care.

Meanwhile my son, Sungsoo, is pursuing studies in computational neuroscience, and my daughter Sungleen, has recently completed her undergraduate degree in English and is exploring further studies.

My personal goals and prayers revolve around maintaining good health through activities such as walking exercising and gardening. Additionally, I hope to witness the growth and fulfilment of my family, our neighbours and our churches as they reach their full potential, all of which we cherish in the presence of Jesus Christ, our Saviour."


#### A hundreth good pointes of husbandrie (1557) by Thomas Tusser.

Some more excerpts from Thomas Tusser's poem from 1557.

- 25 The rye in the ground, while September doth last: October, for wheat sowing, calleth as fast. Whatever it cost thee, whatever thou geue: Have done sowing wheat before Hallowmas eve.
- 26 The moon in the wane, gather fruit on the tree:
  The riper the better, for grass and for thee.
  But michers that loue not, to bie nor to crave:
  Make some gather sooner, else few should they have.
- 27 Or winter doe come, while the weather is good: For gutting thy ground, get the home with thy wood. Set bauen alone, lay the boughs from the blocks: The drier, the les maidens, dablith their dockes.
- 28 For rooting thy ground, ring thy hogs thou hast need:
  The better thou ring them, the better they feed.
  Most times with their elders, the young ones keep best:
  Then yoke well the great knaves, and favour the rest.
- 29 But yoke not thy swine, while thine acorn time last: For divers misfortunes, that happen to fast. Or if thou loue eared, and vn mauned hogs: give eye to thy neighbour, and ear to his dogs.

Taken from *A hundreth good pointes of husbandrie* (1557) Thomas Tusser.

It describes the use of pigs (hogs) in forest management. They ate the acorns, scarified the earth and kept the undergrowth in control.
