

Editorial

"I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people — for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness."

This month includes the first anniversary of the accession of King Charles.

On 8 September 2022, at 3:10 in the afternoon, Elizabeth II, Queen of the United Kingdom and the other Commonwealth realms, and the longest-reigning British monarch, died at Balmoral Castle at the age of 96. Her death was publicly announced at 18:30. King Charles immediately ascended to the throne.



Some stand out memories are her audience with Liz Truss a few days before. On the day in question there was an announcement that she was unwell. The Royal Family gathered in the afternoon and the announcement of her passing in early evening. The new King addressed the nation, which must have been very difficult.

Over the next few days the period of mourning included the Privy Council meeting, the journey south and the lying in state. People queued for hours. Locally we had a well-attended special Church service and proclamation of the new reign. Working life went on until the day of the funeral. It was an amazing time, bringing out the best of the nation. A mixture of history pageantry and genuine loss, amid a sense of hope for the future.

News from Aston Sandford





As I mentioned in last month's magazine, Buckinghamshire Historic Churches Trust's Ride+Stride fund raiser takes places this year on **Saturday 9th September**. As a Trustee of BHCT I urge everyone to support this great cause – either by taking part and getting sponsorship to ride or stride, or to be a meeter and greeter in your local church or, of course, by sponsoring someone for either activity. You never know when your Church will find itself in the position of seeking financial assistance from BHCT (and most if not all of the churches in the benefice have benefitted in the past) – for example for major or urgent repairs or for a roof alarm.

On the day Riders and Striders - cyclists, horse riders and walkers - get sponsorship to visit as many places of worship (not just Church of England establishments) as possible between 10:00am and 6:00pm, while others get sponsorship to sit in churches to welcome the visitors. Half of the money (and half of the gift aid) raised by each person sponsored goes to the Trust and half to your church of choice. Last year Aston Sandford Church raised £435 each for itself and for the Trust just by having a couple of riders and a rota of sponsored sitters in the church. And for the Riders and Striders themselves it is of course a great way to see so many of the truly lovely churches and chapels which we are lucky enough to have in Bucks.

Ride+Stride in 2022 raised £26,610 overall. Why not help to make even more money for this worthy cause this year? For more details see http://bucks-historic-churches.org/ride-stride/.

And, lastly, why not become a member of the support organisation, the Friends of Buckinghamshire Historic Churches, of which I am the chairman? We hold at least three events a year, the last one having been a marvellous tour of the Charterhouse in London, truly one of London's secret gems. Our next will be our annual lecture on Wednesday 8th November at Princes Risborough on the subject of the first things to look for when entering a church. Interesting people who have lived in Stone, no 9 More about Stone's Ernest Woodford, his retirement and his ministry at Stone Methodist Chapel, Eythrope Road (continued from last month):

After Ernest Woodford and his family finally returned from India in the 1920s, he served until 1940 in Ellesmere Port, St Helens and Matlock. In 1939 he bought



"Stairways" Portway Road. Stone, for £700 in preparation for his retirement. The house was bought from Lady Margaret Lamb and Lady Mary Packenham (nee Longford) for £700. This had been two estate workers cottages built in1832, knocked together

and from 1929-1939 part of the Peverel Court estate bought by their mother, the Dowager Lady Longford. A small extra kitchen and bathroom were added to Stairways by Daisy Woodford for family evacuees during WWII - she was reluctant to share!

From 1941 until 1962. on the Aylesbury circuit. Ernest was Minister at Stone Methodist Church. The Stone Wesleyan Methodist Church had been founded in the 1820s in his cottage. by Charlie Poole and 10 of his friends who had been attending the chapel **Bishopstone** in



Charlie's cottage, on the site of the current building, where the first meetings were held, was the original chapel, added to in 1877 when William Ward, next door, sold them his garden. (see the date 1877 on the wall outside). A gallery and a schoolroom followed, a vestry (now the kitchen) and an outside loo.

Sue Spinks remembers Ernest well, a big man with a shock of white hair, and his unusual Sunday School lessons:

"My recollection of him from Sunday School was of his hair raising stories about trekking to isolated villages in India as a missionary and contending with all the jungly flora and fauna including tigers! He would demonstrate how they could creep up on you and leap with a big loud growl, making us jump and yell in our turn (and how cross this made our teacher, Mrs. Atkins!) My mum was their 'charlady' at Stairways and found Mrs. Daisy "a pretty hard taskmaster – too much kneeling and scrubbing!"



Daisy Woodford was also involved in the Chapel, acting as president of the Tuesday Fellowship, founded in the 1850s and still meeting today. In 1962 George and Daisy sold Stairways and moved to Henley to live with their son – both died there in 1970 at 97. Lengthy obituaries of George appeared in both local and national papers. George's funeral was held at Stone Methodist Chapel, conducted by the Rev Reginald Brown, who had worked with him in India. He was cremated at Oxford. This clock hangs in his memory in the Chapel today.

Wildlife Spotlight

We're the Bucks Owl and Raptor Group (BORG), we're a group of volunteers based in Aylesbury, working in partnership with farmers and landowners across the county, building and installing nest boxes and ringing and monitoring barn owls, tawny owls, little



owls and kestrels. The information we gather is used by the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) to see population trends and to aid conservation.

Like most voluntary organisations, our challenges are getting funding to continue with our work and also finding volunteers.

Current projects include a redesign and a replacement of our nest boxes, we have over 600 across the county, to ensure they last longer for both the birds and the landowners. Working with farmer clusters and NGOs.

We've also put a camera in a nest box, which is being live streamed to YouTube (thank you Rapid Rural!), which was for Barn Owls but actually fledged 3 kestrels. The nest box is located on The Waddesdon Estate and can be viewed by following this link - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Q5dBJ-3ZWPQ. All is pretty quiet at the moment since the birds have fledged.

Locally, this year has been a poor year for voles, their population cycle goes in peaks and troughs, this year is a trough year, so the birds have been struggling to get enough food. We decided to intervene with supplementary feeding of the kestrels or they would have perished live on YouTube, no one wants to see that! I've been placing mice at their box for a couple of weeks and will continue until the end of the month. The kestrels are still together as a family, you didn't see much of the male because he rarely entered the box, leaving prey for the chicks outside.

The Bucks Show 1951

I came across this article with illustrations of Hartwell House when I was researching a prize medal for a Guernsey cow. The park around Hartwell House was the venue for the Bucks Show until 1988 and this article is about the Bucks Show held on Thursday 6th September 1951.

The show started in the 1850s as the Royal and Central Bucks Show following the amalgamation of the Royal Bucks Agricultural Association and the Central Bucks

Agricultural Society and remains a highlight of the county calendar. It is interesting that Labour Party Prime Minister Clem Atlee was in attendance. He was the prime minister from 26 July 1945 – 26 October 1951 and agriculture was a priority in post war politics. Legal safeguards were strengthened for tenant farmers and consumers were protected by food subsidies to keep prices low. Farmers were given better subsidies, farm workers had loans to build their own houses and agricultural land that had previously been unusable such as hill sides was developed. Life in the country was improved with better utilities and provision of rural bus services. There was a 20 per cent increase in output between 1947 and 1952,



while Britain adopted one of the most mechanised and efficient farming industries in the world.

He was welcomed by Wallace Charles Devereux, a businessman and engineer, known for his work in the aircraft industry. Post war the industry declined. He lived at 'Meads', on the Stoke Park estate, Buckinghamshire and also owned Round Hill Farm, a Dairy Shorthorn farm at Kimble.



Common excuses for not joining the Parish Council

- "I'm too young". If you are 18 you are old enough.
- "What's the point of just joining a talking shop, they don't do anything". Have you ever been to a meeting? Basing your judgement on watching The Vicar of Dibley is definitely not valid.
- "I haven't got a planning application in at the moment". Putting in for planning has got nothing to do with sitting on the Council, whatever may have happened years ago. In fact, if your own application is discussed by the Council, you must leave the room.
- "I'm too busy, I couldn't commit to attending every single meeting". Meetings are rarely more frequent than one evening a month, and missing the occasional one is perfectly acceptable. Most meetings only take a couple of hours.
- "I'm concentrating on finding a job or furthering my career". Being a local Councillor is a definite plus point to add to a CV. It shows you can make decisions, work in a team, are community minded and pro-active. Prospective employees will be impressed.
- "I haven't lived here very long and I don't know the area well". If you have lived or worked in the Parish for a year you are eligible. Your views as an 'incomer' should be welcomed, as you will probably see things more objectively.
- "Our Parish Council is full of Old Fogeys". Join up and change it then.
- "I'd look like a fool because I would not know what's going on". You will be eased in gently; there is help, advice and more formal training available. The Clerk is the legal officer in the Council, and he or she will explain the rules.



The traditional Common Prayer service takes place out of doors, in front of Hartwell Church. This spectacular and romantic mid-18th-century church is built in the 'Gothic' style. The church was built between 1753 and 1755 to a design by Henry Keene for Sir William Lee. It has two towers and sits in the landscaped grounds of Hartwell House, now a luxurious country hotel. Henry Keene

designed the church for Sir William Lee. It is octagonal with east and west towers, and is thought to echo the chapter house at York Minster.
